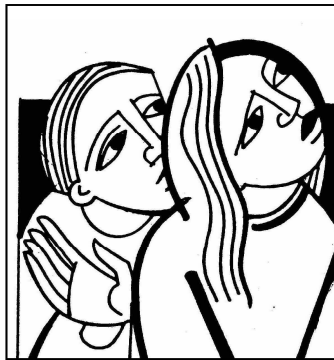

Agenda & Outcomes: March Briefing Session & Meeting

Our Council met on March 12th, for updates and discussion of current strategic planning issues as well as for their consultation and recommendations on the future of our parish and school, the Chapel of Our Lady, and selecting a new Council.

Concerning Christ Light of the Nations School

Since the current strategic plan for Christ Light of the Nations School ends with the 2018-2019 school year, Father Mike and Sister Mary met with Archdiocesan school leaders. In a joint statement following the meeting, the parish confirmed its

commitment *"to the school's current strategic plan, including financial and pastoral support"* highlighting *"the continuing commitment of parish leaders to organizing the stewardship of parish resources and to establishing partnerships that enable parish outreach to the community we are here to serve."* The Education Office *"confirmed the commitment of the Archdiocese to the future of our parish school and to the mission of Catholic education in our community"*.

Father Mike renewed the financial and pastoral commitment of the parish to the 2018-2019 school year. He stated that though the nature and extent of that support might necessarily be re-defined in a new planning process, but it should not be presumed that the parish would end their support for the school. He and Sister Mary expressed no serious concerns about the possibility of the Chapel not be available for the school after May 2018 and received support to move forward with the development of a worship space within the school building.

Outcome of Briefing & Discussion

During the coming year *"as we continue to build a strong network of Catholic schools in the North County Deanery, the Education Office will partner with our parish in reviewing and revising the strategic plan for Christ Light of the Nations School."*



A Ministry of Leadership

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

About 15 years ago the American bishops reaffirmed their commitment to including lay men and women in more leadership roles of the Catholic Church. The organization of the Church must reflect the principle that every Catholic has a right and a responsibility to participate in decision-making that affects their well-being.

Daily, I pray for and thank God for our parishioners and parish leaders. Our parish mission and priorities as well as the work of the Church in North County are well-served in the experience and expertise of our members. May we all be blessed in our openness to God, knowing that our willingness to listen and to respond to the needs of the Church in our time and place, sometimes painful in the personal sacrifice which that entails, will bring new life and growth to the Church.

Concerning the Future of the Chapel of Our Lady & Former Parish Rectory

During 2017 (March – October) the continuing use of the Chapel was discussed within the parish and with parish leaders. Though a consensus on what to do could not be reached, a majority of parish leaders supported Father Mike in making a decision, resulting in the Chapel no longer being used for the celebration of a parish weekend Mass after December 31st, 2018.

The parish must now consider the most reasonable and responsible use of these facilities by the parish or by the Archdiocese or other entity. Since July 2016 these buildings have been underutilized and the parish has not developed plans for their greater use. In addition, serious proposals from other organizations have not been forthcoming. In light of this recent history and for the sake of parish viability into the future, serious consideration must be given to the sale of these properties.

In preparation for meetings with parish and school leaders Father Mike and Sister Mary again met with Archdiocesan leaders regarding the possibility of selling the Chapel and former rectory property, gathering information on –

- Surveying and legally subdividing the school property from the church-rectory property prior to placing it on the market for sale
- Engaging a real estate company experienced in the sale of such properties and marketing in the North County area
- Covering the cost of utilities and hiring a management company for the security and maintenance of the property and facilities until they are sold

Should parish leaders recommend the sale of the property to Father Mike and should the Archbishop accept this recommendation, the Office of Building and Real Estate will assist and support the parish in these matters. If our parish does want to sell the property, the Director of the Office encouraged us to make a recommendation and seek the approval of the Archbishop in order to begin this work as soon as possible and close on the sale of the property in the summer or fall of this year.

During January and February this possibility was discussed by the School Board, Parish Finance Committee, and our Pastoral Leadership Team.

Questions were raised for discussion and clarification.

Expressed concerns included -

- Developing an adequate worship space within the current school building
- Questioning how visible our Catholic identity in the community would be without a church building near our elementary and high school facilities
- Developing suitable alternative uses for these facilities has not been actively pursued over the past 18-24 months and is not now a priority for parish or Archdiocesan leaders
- Evaluating the risks and justifying the expense of our parish owning and maintaining underutilized buildings while striving for a balanced parish budget by June 2018

Finally, if a serious alternative use for these facilities cannot be developed soon and if the parish prefers to sell the property as soon as possible after May 2018, Archdiocesan leaders encouraged us to make a recommendation and seek the approval of the Archbishop sooner than later considering the work that now needs to get underway.

Outcome of Briefing & Discussion

Members of the School Board, Finance Committee, Pastoral Leadership Team, and Pastoral Council have recommended that we sell the property and facilities of the Chapel of Our Lady and former rectory and that Father Mike write the Archbishop to report on these consultations and to request his approval to do so.

Concerning the Selection of a New Pastoral Council

Council members reviewed and briefly discussed their experience of serving together and their achievements over the past 5 years. They began to identify the issues and opportunities which ought to inform the vision and the responsibilities of our next Pastoral Council.

Outcome of Briefing & Discussion

In the near future Father Mike will propose for Council members a selection process and timeline with the hope of forming a small working group this spring that will work toward commissioning a new Council later this year or early next year.

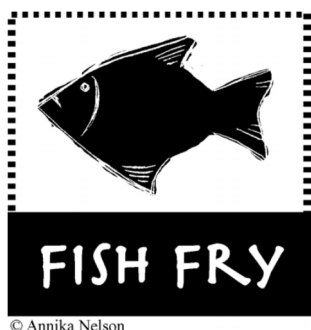
