

Signs, Chapter 1

Signs are not just rectangles with letters and pictures. Signs can be things and events, natural or created. Reminding us of something beyond themselves, they can inspire, frighten, instruct, endear.

Genesis, chapter 9, says the rainbow is a sign of God's choice to sustain all life on earth. (Father Mike compares it to a Post-it© note, reminding the God of Noah not to send another flood.)

One time another priest at the altar looked past the congregation into the vestibule. He spied a woman dancing with a baby in her arms, unaware that anyone was looking. The priest saw a sign of how love can take you out of the present moment. Two Sundays later, he mentioned that enchanting vision in a homily. A listener moved by the image wrote a poem about it.

A favorite sign of a couple hundred parishioners is the Easter fire. On Holy Saturday, just after nightfall, we gather on the church's front steps. We fill the porch, so we're shoulder to shoulder. That's unusual but comforting. On the sidewalk below, a deacon lights a small but very visible bonfire. Our pastor blesses and decorates the majestic Paschal Candle. We all share the light on hand-held candles. The deacon sings, "Christ, our Light." But we Catholic worshipers are not the only ones who see this sign. Drivers who normally speed by slow down. Some stop. You can almost hear the passengers saying, "Well that's pretty. What does it mean? It makes me want to investigate."

A new kind of sign is, or will be soon, front and center outside our church (on the steps facing Ashbrook Drive). Look for it, and watch this space for more information.

CALLED BY GOD

Today's scriptures invite us to listen to two calls. The first is the call issued by the LORD to the prophet Amos, the "shepherd and a dresser of sycamores" (Amos 7:14). The second is the call the Lord Jesus issued to the Twelve, whom he sent out "two by two" (Mark 6:7). These faithful people responded to the call, prophesying and preaching to the people to whom they had been sent. Each of us received a call when we were baptized. The second reading invites us to ponder that call as we are reminded that we are chosen in Christ and that, in love, God "destined us for adoption" (Ephesians 1:5). As adopted daughters and sons of God we are called to bring the presence of Christ into our marriages, families, schools, and places of work. Let us be inspired today to say yes to Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
