

EVERY YEAR PARISHES participates in the **Archdiocesan Mission Cooperation Plan** designed to connect mission groups to parishes to speak about the work of our Church in other parts of the world. It's a good reminder for us that our Church is fundamentally a Mission Church.

This plan, an initiative of the Society of the Propagation of the Faith in St. Louis, helps us learn more about the missionary activity of our Catholic Church.

There are **two great benefits for our Church** when we do this. First, every parish is enriched and strengthened when parishioners learn how other people and parishes are practicing their faith, often in difficult circumstances. Second, our spiritual and material solidarity with mission parishes enables them to exist and to grow. It's a two-way street! The mission sending and receiving character of a parish is a sure evidence of its health and well-being - its viability.

Called & Gifted to be a Redeeming Community Solidarity in the Mission of Christ

Next weekend please welcome to our parish **Father David Eliaona Lyimo**, who will be with us as part of the **Archdiocesan Mission Cooperation Plan**. Father David works with the **Congregation of the Daughters of Mary-Tabora** (CDMT).

This Congregation, with its headquarters in the Archdiocese of Tabora, was founded in 1933 by the Missionaries of Africa. It was established in response to the tremendous social, economic and spiritual needs of the local people. The "**Charisma**" of the congregation is **love and service**, and all the community members live their Charisma by engaging in different activities such as health care, pastoral ministry, social works, education, women and youth development.

Education and healthcare services are particularly directed to rural areas where they serve poor nomadic people, orphans, and deaf children. **Healthcare One** is a health center, it is located at Endulen Village in the Ngorongoro Conservation area. Most of the people who are brought to the clinic are those attacked by wild animals such as elephants, buffalo, lions, leopards, and snakes. Since most of these people walk between 9-10 miles to reach help, or use donkeys as their means of transportation, many patients lose their lives on the way to the clinic.

The people who suffer the most are children and expectant mothers who die on the way to the clinic because of the lack of transportation. Pregnant women

with a problem pregnancy also suffer the same. To meet the needs of patients who are in critical condition, the Sisters need an ambulance to speed transportation to proper and prompt care. They also have a critical need for hospital beds. Many times, patients are forced to share one bed and some sleep on the floor because of the shortage of beds.

Together with Father David, I invite you to be partners in the work of the Daughters of Mary, to make a difference in the lives of the suffering poor with your prayer and financial support. Your generous support will be used to build a well to collect rain water for domestic uses at the school in Tabora Archdiocese. Be assured that your support and prayers are so much appreciated and will always be put to good use.

Welcome to Our Parish

Father David Eliaona Lyimo was born the sixth child of a family of ten and grew up literally on the slopes of Mt. Kilimanjaro, in Moshi, Tanzania. However, he refers to the parish of **Kambi ya Simba** in Tanzania as his home.

He attended Catholic primary school for boys discerning the priesthood, and upper secondary school at Kilimanjaro Boys Secondary school. He then earned a degree in philosophy at Precious Blood Seminary. He left home for Uganda to pursue a life in the Congregation of the Holy Cross on August 8th, 1998. He was ordained January 26th, 2008, in Kambi ya Simba, serving there until beginning his studies at Notre Dame University, where he is now pursuing an advanced degree in theology.

Father David will be sharing with our parish the work of the Daughters of Mary-Tanzania and their critical need to continue their expanded ministry of teaching to and caring for the children who are orphaned because of the growing AIDS epidemic.

\$47,965 2018 PARISH GOAL

This year just over half (127 donors) of the 252 parish households participating in the Appeal were able to increase their gift or pledge from the previous year for a net increase of \$6,383 dollars. In addition, we can also report that 91 households maintained their contributions from the previous year, and 29 members for various reasons chose to decrease their contributions totaling \$3,437. 


