An Invitation to a More Abundant Life

Crazy Love - One Sign You May Be On The Way

St. Luke’s Gospel story of Jesus calling disciples at the Lake of Gennesaret must have haunted the early church for many years. He writes of their **“astonishment”** at the size of the catch. Something unexplainable happened. They must have pondered this for years! They were tired and likely their best fishing skills were not in play. Why did they trust Jesus to head out into deeper waters? In the end, **“They left everything and followed him”**. How did they explain their leaving to their families and friends? What could be more important than your livelihood and loved ones? It’s crazy!

In my life and work as a priest I have found and worked with disciples like this. I have been inspired by their generosity and supported by the sacrifices they have made. I’ve also been instructed in the truth and wonder of this miracle at Gennesaret when they’ve told me, **“Father, I’m getting much more out of this than I’m putting into it.”**

Years later, John the Evangelist finds a phrase for what the disciples found at Gennesaret and the early Church experienced - **“abundant life”**. This is the promise of trusting Jesus, raised from the dead, especially when we’re told to **“put out into deep water”**.

Our **Archdiocesan Lay Formation Program** described below is a calling to a deeper participation of parish members in the life and love of Jesus Christ. Established in 2013 this three year formation program strives to ensure that parishes come to experience **“abundant life”**. The Program is funded completely by the Annual Catholic Appeal with no charge to the parish or the participants. This third cohort of parishioners from across the Archdiocese will begin meeting one Saturday per month in September 2019.



Remembering and Celebrating the Presence of Christ Among Us

Warmly Welcome Visiting Priests

For the next several weeks Father Mike will be away from the parish vacationing with one of his classmates. He will be returning on Saturday, March 2nd. Please warmly welcome the visiting priests who will be presiding for the celebrations of the Eucharist in our parish while he is away.

Fathers **Ray Iwuji** of our parish and **John Vogler** are scheduled for the Masses here on the weekend of February 16th & 17th. The following weekend Father **John Nickolai**, the associate pastor serving St. Rose Philippine Duchesne Parish will preside for Mass on Saturday evening and Father **John Vogler** for Masses on Sunday morning. Please continue to show them the warm welcome of our community that has been so typically experienced by those priests we've invited to be of service to our parishioners.

For our weekday celebrations, **Father Ray** will preside for Mass on several occasions and one of our parish deacons, **George Watson** or **Matt Duban**, will presider for Communion Services on other days. Please **CAREFULLY CHECK THE BULLETIN EACH WEEK** for the details of when and where these celebrations will take place.

Through, with, & in Christ, we are called to participate in the life of the Church by living the Christian vocation, by acting as a leaven in the home, parish, workplace, and civic community, by developing an ability to engage with the culture of today, and by drawing others to Christ.

Please join me in giving thanks for each of these priests and deacons who have so generously put themselves at the service of our community.

Planning For The Future

In 2015 pastors and parish leaders in every parish of our Archdiocese were trained and completed a process of assessing the viability of their parishes for the future. At that time it was clear that **staffing our parishes** was already challenging and certainly was going to be a **critical issue** in the years to come. Addressing **the need for more lay leaders** - employed as **pastoral ministers** and **servng as volunteers** - will be necessary for every parish and region in our Archdiocese.

Recently the Council of Priests who advise the Archbishop received and will continue discussion of a report on the number of parishes and priests in our Archdiocese. Presuming that the religious order priests (Jesuits, Franciscans, Vincentians, and others) now staffing 19 parishes remains constant, and the number of ordinations, retirements, and deaths remains relatively predictable, **in 7 to 8 years we will reach the point of having one diocesan priest per parish no matter the size of the parish.** At that time without planning there will be no replacements when a priest retires or dies.

Currently we have 187 worship sites, 42 (23%) are staffed by 2 or more priests, 85 (46%) by one diocesan priest alone, and 28 (15%) by one priest caring for 2 sites. Twenty-five (25/13%) are staffed by non-diocesan priests or Parish Life Coordinators.

We now have 315 diocesan priests. Of this number 143 (45%) serve as pastors/ administrators and 40 (13%) as full or part time associates. Sixty-nine (69/22%) are retired, of whom 20 continue to serve in parishes. Twenty-six (26/8%) serve in non-parish assignments or outside the Archdiocese.




