An Invitation to a More Abundant Life

Crazy Love - One Sign You May Be On The Way

St. Luke’s Gospel story of Jesus calling disciples at the Lake of Gennesaret must have haunted the early church for many years. He writes of their *“astonishment”* at the size of the catch. Something unexplainable happened. They must have pondered this for years! They were tired and likely their best fishing skills were not in play. Why did they trust Jesus to head out into deeper waters? In the end, *“They left everything and followed him”*. How did they explain their leaving to their families and friends? What could be more important than your livelihood and loved ones? It’s crazy!

In my life and work as a priest I have found and worked with disciples like this. I have been inspired by their generosity and supported by the sacrifices they have made. I’ve also been instructed in the truth and wonder of this miracle at Gennesaret when they’ve told me, *“Father, I’m getting much more out of this than I’m putting into it.”*

Years later, John the Evangelist finds a phrase for what the disciples found at Gennesaret and the early Church experienced - *“abundant life”*. This is the promise of trusting Jesus, raised from the dead, especially when we’re told to *“put out into deep water”*.

Our **Archdiocesan Lay Formation Program** described below is a calling to a deeper participation of parish members in the life and love of Jesus Christ. Established in 2013 this three year formation program strives to ensure that parishes come to experience *“abundant life”*. The Program is funded completely by the Annual Catholic Appeal with no charge to the parish or the participants. This third cohort of parishioners from across the Archdiocese will begin meeting one Saturday per month in September 2019.



Reflections on Our Journey of Faith

*Through the Church, God gives us this **joyful season** when we recall the great events that gave us **new life in Christ.***

The Destructive Power of Sin. When we fail to live as children of God, we often behave in a destructive way towards our neighbors and other creatures - and ourselves as well - since we begin to think more or less consciously that we can use them as we will. The root of all evil, as we know, is sin, which from its first appearance has disrupted our communion with God, with others, and with creation itself.

Once God's law, the law of love, is forsaken, then the law of the strong over the weak takes over. Sin takes the shape of greed and unbridled pursuit of comfort, lack of concern for the good of others and even oneself. It leads to the exploitation of creation, both persons and the environment, due to that insatiable covetousness which sees every desire as a right and sooner or later destroys all those in its grip.

The Healing Power of Repentance and Forgiveness. Creation urgently needs the revelation of the children of God, who have been made a new creation. The path through Lent and Easter to Pentecost demands that we renew our faces and hearts as Christians through repentance, conversion, and forgiveness, so as to live fully the abundant grace of the paschal mystery.

These sacred seasons invite Christians to embody the paschal mystery more deeply and concretely in their personal, family, and social lives, above all by the fasting, prayer, and almsgiving which encourage our needed conversions and inspire us for the demands of discipleship.

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

“For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him.” (John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows: Ash Wednesday (March 6, 2019) and Good Friday (April 19, 2019) are days of abstinence for all Catholics over the age of 14. On these two days, fast, as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Here again Catholics will not hold themselves lightly excused, but if there is a serious health problem, this obligation would not apply. We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance. Following are several resources that can aid in finding different forms of prayer and penance.

FOOD PANTRY

PLEASE do not place perishable items (meats, produce, dairy products) in the Food Pantry Bins in the vestibules of church. These bins are not cleared out on a day to day basis, therefore we have experienced some spoiled and rotten food. Our Food Pantry distributes food on the second Saturday of the month only! We accept all canned goods, boxed dinners, canned meats etc. We appreciate your generosity and thank you for your support!
