

Parish Staffing - An Investment in Our Future

Called to be Stewards of Place & Time

I announced here at the end of June that **Steve Jones**, who has served our parish as Maintenance Coordinator for almost 15 years would be moving to part time employment through the end of the year and then retire.

Steve has been a trustworthy co-worker with me in the establishment of our parish and has truly helped me meet the challenges of parish administration. He has also supported and worked closely with other parish leaders, service providers, and contractors to insure our buildings are in good shape and our systems are efficient, all of which helps to insure the future of our parish. His skills and good judgment have helped us to be good stewards of our buildings and of our parish financial resources.

TIMELINE FOR OUR HIRING PROCESS

With the support of our Finance Committee, Pastoral Leadership Team, and Human Resource Office of the Archdiocese, we have now finalized a position description for a new maintenance coordinator for our parish. To the right you will find the job posting for this position which will be published during the coming weeks in a number of parish bulletins as well as in the *St. Louis Review* and on-line at the Archdiocesan web-site.

I would encourage any parishioners who may be interested to apply for this position. You may also know someone who you think may be interested and has the qualifications. By all means pass this information on to them. The following information about our hiring process may also be helpful for you or others to know

Mid August 2019

Position opening is posted and applications will be received through September 9th.

Early to Mid September

Applications will be reviewed as they are received and candidates interviews will be scheduled.

October 2019

We are hoping to fill the position during this month, allowing, allowing for a period of orientation and training with our current maintenance coordinator prior to his retirement at the end of the year.

This would now be a good time for everyone to think about what skills, talents, or interests they may have to offer our **Capital Improvements Committee**, which is also an important resource for the maintenance and use of our parish facilities and our Maintenance Coordinator.

We have a youth room with lots of fun stuff, a history of activities to build a program on, we have a parish budget that supports us, and I will be willing to support and help whoever God nudges to lead our youth in the future as well as Deacon Matt and Rhonda Finney who have been so generous with their time and support in the midst of full time jobs.

Our youth are worthy of our love and attention and they need us more now than ever!
