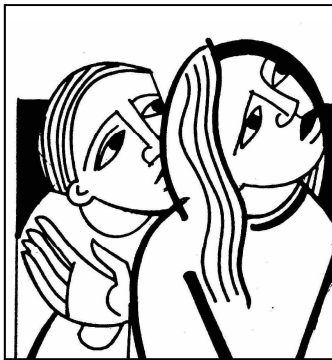

Mr. Steve Jones, a 2019 recipient from Holy Name of Jesus Parish of the annual **Cardinal Rigali Service Award**. This annual program provides recognition and expresses appreciation to outstanding, long-term employees & volunteers of parishes, schools, and others entities of the Archdiocese of St. Louis.

The Cardinal Rigali Service Award Ceremony will take place on **Wednesday, September 18th** in the St. Vincent de Paul Chapel at the Cardinal Rigali Pastoral Center with a catered luncheon & awards ceremony following Mass.

Since 2005 Steve has generously served our parish as **Maintenance Coordinator**. From our establishment as a parish he has been a trustworthy co-worker with me, truly helping us to meet the challenges of parish administration. He has also supported and worked closely with other parish leaders, service providers, and contractors so that our buildings are in good shape and our systems are efficient and well maintained. Steve has faithfully and generously served to insure that our parish facilities and property are well maintained, a key element of our present vitality and the future viability of our parish.

He first began working in school and parish maintenance at Corpus Christi Parish in 1989. His skills and good judgment have helped us to be good stewards of our buildings and of our parish financial resources. Steve also has a strong sense of beauty and order which has helped to make our parish grounds and public areas attractive and

inviting to visitors. His oversight and attention to detail make our facilities comfortable and efficient for parish gatherings and programs.

He has also been an essential part of our intentional effort to lease space in our buildings to other organizations whose programs and staff support the work of our parish and the mission of our Catholic Church in North County. These partners in mission now include two agencies of Catholic Charities (St. Francis Community Services and St. Louis Counseling) and the Archdiocesan Parish Support Office which provides accounting services for parishes in St. Louis City and County as well as St. Charles County.

As many of you are probably aware Steve is now working part time and will be retiring at the end of this year after 30 years of service to the Church. This week we will formally celebrate our appreciation. I encourage everyone to find a way to thank him personally as well.

Graduates have spent up to three years to achieve goals in education, employment, financial literacy, and social skills. Their graduation signifies their success in achieving the goals they have set for themselves through Pathways.

Wear comfortable clothing for a few minutes of stretching and movement.

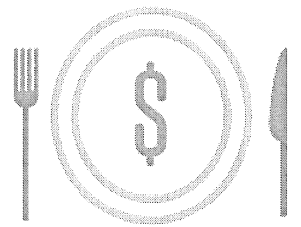
