





## OPEN HOUSE TODAY - COME VISIT & EXPLORE!

We encourage you to visit with our staff, parishioners, and service providers who are stationed throughout our parish facilities. We want you to explore and find out more about the work of our parish – and our Church – in this community. We believe that reaching out to the needs of our community is a work of human development and fundamentally a work of evangelization. It will enable our parish to have a long-term presence here and our Catholic Church to be well known as caring about the real needs of the poor.

**OUR PARISH CHURCH** – Visit with members of our Liturgy Committee to find out more about our worship space and our commitment to engaging our parishioners in the celebration of Mass. Our members are involved in all liturgical ministries. On average we have a total of 300 – 325 participants attending one of three weekend Masses. You are always welcome here to give thanks to God for the gift of our Catholic faith and for the work of our Church.

**OUR COMMUNITY CENTER** – Formerly the site of a parish school this building now serves as the primary gathering place for our parishioners and parish organizations. Today's fellowship will give you a taste of how this space is commonly used. Our parish dinners and fish fries are especially well attended by our parishioners and residents of the community. **Display Tables** here today will give you information about our school as well as other parish and community organizations. **Visit the 1st Floor Upstairs** to learn more about the *Archdiocesan Shared Accounting* service for parishes in St. Louis and St. Charles Counties as well as the City of St. Louis; and the *Pathways to Progress Initiative* assisting families break the cycle of poverty in their lives now and for the sake of their children's future.

**OUR PARISH OFFICE CENTER** – This building was renovated in 2006 to serve the needs of our Parish Staff and provides space for **Parish Administration** and leadership as well as organizations, ministries, and services to the community. These include mental health services provided here by *St. Louis Counseling*; a short term emergency shelter program for homeless women and families known as *Room At The Inn*; and a *St. Vincent de Paul Society* food pantry and utility assistance program.

**PARISH LIFE BY THE NUMBERS** - Since our Deanery's 2005 pastoral reorganization, our parish has paid close attention to our viability for the future. We support both old and new ways of being a vital parish. We pay careful attention to being a stable parish.

Holy Name of Jesus Parish has 592 household (1,128 members). This year we anticipate revenues of \$490,560 (81% / \$397,146 from offertory gifts) to cover 84% of expenses (\$584,726) including a \$50,000 investment in our parish school, Christ Light of the Nations.

Our school provides a quality Catholic education for 143 students, 28 (20%) Catholic and 115 (80%) of other faith traditions or families with no religious affiliation. This year our school expects to have \$1.3 million of expenses and \$1.26 million of revenues, including \$635,916 (50%) from tuition/fees, \$168,367 (13%) from scholarships, and \$550,000 (44%) in Archdiocesan support.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Although the hours of daylight are rapidly dwindling, many people would say that these October days bring the year's most splendid weather. Americans are riders and joggers, not strollers, and so the pleasures of the season are often lost on us. This is not the case with many Jewish people, who observe an ancient rule in walking to synagogue on the Sabbath. On city streets and suburban sidewalks in many cities, we may notice around sunset the nicely dressed families walking and chatting on Friday afternoon. After a short prayer at dusk, the families stroll home again for a relaxing and festive meal. They return to synagogue in the morning, and then spend an afternoon in family leisure until three stars appear in the night sky and Sabbath ends.

Catholics, on the other hand, pile into the car and drive even a short distance to Mass; some even divide the family to participate at different hours. For Jews, the leisurely walk marks a dividing line between hectic life commitments and a day of abundant joy and enrichment. Before we became an automobile culture, Catholics embraced a similar pace, and in most places walked to church. These lovely days of fall invite us to tap into an old and life-giving tradition. If you live within a mile of your church, walk next week. If you must drive, park at a good distance and walk the rest of the way. Talk about your life, greet strangers, notice the crunch of leaves under your shoes. You may be surprised at how different Sunday Mass feels when it is framed by leisure!






