

a healthy & holy parish

Our health and our holiness always go together. God expects us to care for ourselves and each other in mind, heart, body, and soul. This is especially true during a health

crisis - whether personal or in our community. We received the following information from the Office of the Archbishop with encouragement to let you know what we are doing in our parish and can do for each other.

"As the coronavirus becomes more prevalent in the nation's headlines, we are expecting questions to arise regarding the preparedness of our parishes in dealing with the outbreak. There is no cause for panic, but precautionary measures should be taken at this time to mitigate the spread of colds, flu, and other contagious illnesses."

what are the facts?

As of this past Monday we would emphasize the following information as known to be true:

- ◆ Seasonal flu is currently making a bigger impact in our communities. There have been 10,000 deaths from flu in the U.S. this season, and two deaths from coronavirus so far.
- ◆ The potential global public health threat posed by this virus is high; however, right now, the immediate risk to most Americans is low.
- ◆ People at greater risk are those who have recently traveled to China or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19.

what are we doing as a parish?

- ◆ Temporarily we will suspend the distribution of Holy Communion under the form of the consecrated wine.
- ◆ When we resume this practice we will continue to sanitize all sacred vessels with soap and hot water after every Mass because germs may survive on surfaces up to 24 hours.
- ◆ Once a week the Holy Water Fonts in church are emptied and sanitized.
- ◆ Our extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are reminded of the importance of cleaning and sanitizing their hands as described below.

- ◆ We encourage you for the foreseeable future to exchange the Sign of Peace without physical contact.
- ◆ When possible simply be a bit more aware of how close you may be to your nearest neighbor, keeping your distance if you think there is a good reason.
- ◆ Since receiving Holy Communion in the hand is encouraged, we ask you to do so that our clergy and Eucharistic ministers may avoid contact with saliva.
- ◆ Practice good hygiene, including the use of alcohol-based hand sanitizer located at the entrances of church and in our restrooms as well as proper cough and sneeze control.
- ◆ Anyone who has a fever, sore throat, respiratory infection or may have the symptoms of a cold or the flu should always stay home from church - it's the most graceful thing to do and never sinful.
- ◆ Our elderly parishioners - who are among the most vulnerable - are reminded that they have the option of staying home and participating in the televised Mass on EWTN, KPLR Channel 11 (CW, 8:30 am), or KTVI Channel 2.2 (Antenna TV, Fox2now) at 9:00 am.

(Anyone confined at home for more than a few weeks should call the Parish Office and we will try to arrange for Holy Communion to be brought to your place of residence.)

- ◆ Help to identify those who are more at risk (i.e., elderly people living alone, persons with disabilities, children and teens) and check on them.



CHANGE

Lent is all about change and change is usually not easy. In order to change we have to leave something behind. Today we hear about a very old man who decides to answer God's call. Abram experiences a tremendous amount of change when he leaves everything behind, risking it all for God's promise. Jesus changes, is transfigured, right before the eyes of his disciples. The Lenten scriptures issue the call for us to change, to be transfigured, so that we, too, will soon share in the glory of God. What is it that the Lord is asking us to leave behind? Are we willing to take the risk for the promise made by God? These questions are at the heart of the Lenten journey of conversion.




