



## 2020 annual catholic appeal because we are catholic

Together, as one Church, we reach out to people in need, not because they are Catholic, but because we are Catholic. We seek out the homeless. We feed the hungry. We serve families and protect the unborn. We provide clinics, counseling, and food pantries. We give tuition help and teacher training for schools. We do all this and much more because we are Catholic.

*We often forget why we are living on this earth, and we should not take what we are fortunate to have in life for granted.*

Last fall **Lauren Swindle**, a member of our parish and student at Trinity Catholic High School, in an essay on the Appeal put it this way: ***“It is important for all of us Catholics to see ... how they are change lives and how we can help them do so. It is a united group effort ...”***

This year’s Appeal faces many unique challenges. It is essential for the work of the Church in our Archdiocese. But, we’ve never attempted a major fundraising project in this type of an environment. Gifts and pledges for all of us - in whatever amounts we can realistically now afford - will help us to achieve our parish goals.

In her own life - and for our benefit - Lauren also wrote: ***“Stewardship to me means that we should give back to Jesus for all that he has done for each of us.”*** The Appeal is not just something we do. It is a reflection of who we are. ***“We often forget why we are living on this earth, and we should never forget why because He never forgets us .... we should not take what we are fortunate to have in life, for granted. God has given each of us unique and distinct talents and we should put those good gifts into use.”***

High school students from across the Archdiocese participated in this essay contest about our Annual Catholic Appeal. Hers was one of the winning essay for which she was awarded a scholarship. With the support of our elementary and high schools, her family, and our parish she’s grown in the conviction that ***“... my church is a big part of who I am and knowing my church is flourishing is a positive reassurance.”***

Lauren’s essay is an evidence of the importance and value of the Appeal which supports so many of our Church’s charitable, educational, and social service works and programs. Let’s join our faith to hers especially in these times of great suffering and need. ***“I always pray for God’s guidance ... and I can feel a sense of relief in doing so. I also pray when I get down on myself and seem to struggle and become overwhelmed.”***

## proclaiming a spirit of generosity toward all

*Where has the coronavirus gone, is it still among us? All fifty states have reduced their restrictions to some extent, some more than others. Many businesses have reopened with some restrictions that tend to vary from one state to another. In some states and areas, we see people acting as if everything is normal. That is, they are no longer abiding by the suggestions of scientists, such as wearing masks, maintaining social distance (6 feet apart from one another), and avoiding crowded gatherings.*

*It is only natural for individuals to want to relax and celebrate to some extent after being sheltered in their homes and barred from gathering in some venues for several months. However, during times like this, they need to be mindful that their health and the health of their loved ones are at stake. We still need to maintain some sense of caution.*

*No matter what the states are doing, scientists tell us that it is still a fact that the virus is still among us and will be with us until a vaccine has been developed to prevent us from being infected. Therefore, we still need to continue to practice those means that are helping us avoid becoming victims for a little while longer.*

*Once again, these include wearing masks, maintaining social distance, and avoiding large crowds. In fact, a recent study found that wearing masks alone reduces the transmission rate of the virus by 75 percent. Of course, there are some individuals who believe or say masks do not make a difference. If they do not, why do doctors and nurses working in hospitals wear them? They have been wearing them for many years. Why take a chance?*

*(Dr. Thomas has been encouraging the Churches of North County to be united in this important effort. Holy Name of Jesus Parish has been a member of NCCU since November 2013.)*


