

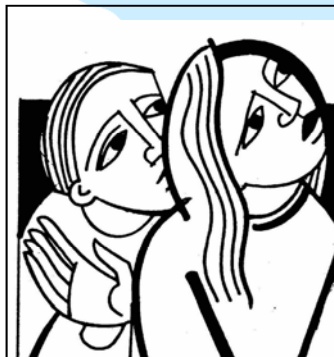

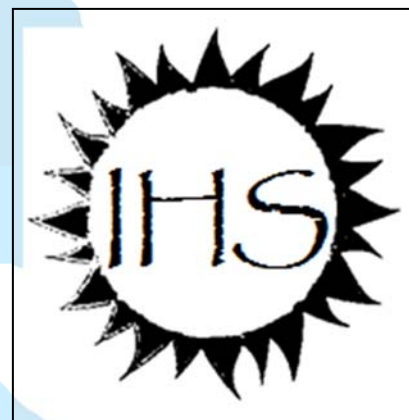

## Room at the Inn

Room at the Inn is a charity **assisting homeless women and children** in the St. Louis County area. Room at the Inn **networks with area churches** to provide a safe place for clients to have dinner, spend the night and have breakfast in the morning. Holy Name of Jesus is one of these network churches.

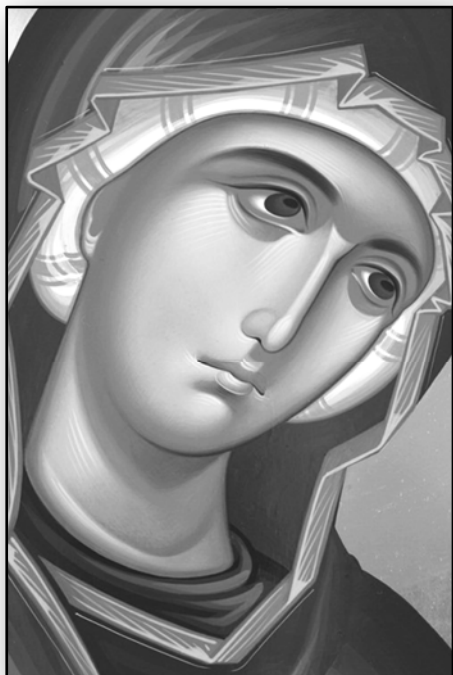
## partnerships as a parish priority

## LIVING IN THE ABSENCE OF ANGELS

We can sometimes forget that faith is a two-way street. Angels reveal that we can trust God’s presence and care for us in our troubles and difficulties. But, angels also remind us—especially in their absence, when we think they’re not around—that God has faith in us. We are gifted in ourselves and with each other. We human beings have all that we need, not simply to survive but to thrive. Our very existence, much less the quality of our lives, so often hinges on putting every once of our minds, hearts, bodies, and souls into what needs to be done.
