the feast of epiphany - making known the name of jesus

the power and promise of our parish name

This week we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus. It was restored to the Roman liturgical calendar in 2002 and chosen as our parish name in 2005, from over 100 suggestions from 1,100 individuals who participated in the nominating process. From as early as the 3rd century the **monogram** – **IHS** – has been used by Christians to symbolize **the name of Jesus**. It represents our belief that Jesus Christ is our savior and redeemer. The monogram come from **the first three letters in the Greek spelling of Jesus' name**. Those letters are iota ("I"), eta ("H"), and sigma (here rendered as its Roman equivalent: "S". In Greek, "Jesus Christ" would be spelled as follows:

IHSOUS CHRISTOS

The monogram for the name of Jesus has been used in Christian art and architecture for centuries and is still a popular religious symbol. St. Ignatius of Loyola associated the following motto with this monogram:

Ad Maiorem Dei Gloriam ... Inque Hominum Salutem

(For the Greater Glory of God) (and the Salvation of Humanity)

Ignatius firmly believed this motto captures the **Christian conviction** that any work that is not evil, even one normally considered inconsequential to the spiritual life, can be spiritually meritorious, if performed to give glory to God. It is our mission to make known the name of Jesus. Each of us has been called to make sure that when people meet us they encounter the love of Christ in ordinary ways. In turn, God's extraordinary love is made known to others.

This is the true joy in life:

Being used for a purpose recognized by yourself as a mighty one, being a force of nature instead of a feverish, selfish little clod of ailments and grievances, complaining that the world will not devote itself to making you happy.

I am of the opinion that my life belongs to the whole community and as long as I live, it is my privilege to do for it what I can.

It is a sort of **splendid torch** which I have got hold of for the moment and **I want to make it burn as brightly as possible** before handing it on to future generations.



Kick-off date: Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021 Time: 4 PM – 6 PM

Cost: \$10.00 per dinner: Dinner includes: 2 pieces fried fish, spaghetti, cole slaw, white bread, 2 packets of tartar sauce

Masks will be required to enter the Cafeteria, where everyone will need to keep 6' distance in line as you wait to get your food. When it's your turn to pay, you'll be given a ticket for each dinner you purchase. Food will be pretty much ready to go so that all you have to do is pick it up at the window and be on your way.

We are unable to initially offer menu choices due to the precautions that must be taken due Covid. This should mean less time in line for you.

There will be no dessert sales, nor any beverages available. This could change as Lent goes on.

At a later date, we are hoping we can once again offer dine-in service.

We wanted to let you know what is planned, and hope to see many of you there. Even though the fish fries may look a bit different, our food is still delicious and our parishioners are extremely friendly! Hope you can join us.
