First and foremost, I want to thank EVERYONE for their continued support of ROOM. The support, calls, assistance, etc., has just been well beyond belief. We are truly blessed!

The shelter is almost full. We do require a negative COVID-19 test before we allow new clients to stay at our shelter. During the summer months, our client census was very low. We have been full ever since. Unfortunately, some clients violated our rules and had to be exited. We are looking to receive two new clients on Friday, assuming their test results are negative, Currently, they are at a Motel waiting for test results. Next week we will receive additional clients putting us at full capacity.

For the Holidays, we had Thanksgiving dinner delivered by Temple Israel. The clients were treated to Pizza and Wings, provided by a generous donor, for Christmas Eve, and for Christmas day, they cooked two turkeys for a special Feast. This year we asked for gift cards. We received plenty so that we could take our clients and they were able to shop for gifts for themselves and for their children. This allowed everyone to get gifts and to get the gifts that each client wanted.

Thanks again to our many volunteers, our holiday decorations were better than ever. New trees, decorations, and new decorations for the outside of our building that even included lights. Our building, inside and out, was truly beautiful.

We are still sheltering in place, requiring extra staff, extra food, and a major hit to our budget. We thank our partner congregations for continuing to support us financially for the nights they were to serve. In talking with several of our partner congregations, I get the sense that sheltering in place may continue until the end of March 2021.

Again, the Board, the Staff and I want to say thanks and wish everyone a very happy, healthy, and safe New Year. I know 2021 will be better for all!

Masks will be required to enter the Cafeteria, where everyone will need to keep 6' distance in line as you wait to get your food. When it's your turn to pay, you'll be given a ticket for each dinner you purchase. Food will be pretty much ready to go so that all you have to do is pick it up at the window and be on your way.

We are unable to initially offer menu choices due to the precautions that must be taken due Covid. This should mean less time in line for you.

There will be no dessert sales, nor any beverages available. This could change as Lent goes on.

At a later date, we are hoping we can once again offer dine-in service.

We wanted to let you know what is planned, and hope to see many of you there. Even though the fish fries may look a bit different, our food is still delicious and our parishioners are extremely friendly! Hope you can join us.
