### briefly in parish news

Throughout the summer and fall our Facilities Maintenance Team has been working with Fr. Mike and Archdiocesan Office of Building and Real Estate on the sale of Christ Light of the Nations School. In addition to the ongoing security and maintenance of the building, we have been finalizing boundary surveys and title descriptions in order to market the property to interested buyers as well as to transfer ownership of several athletic fields to Trinity Catholic High School. In lieu of the gift of this property to the High School Association, the Archdiocese will reimburse our parish for the expense of the survey and title work as well as the market appraisal, about \$23,000. Join me in thanking Pat Barrett, Mike Petroff, Joe Vassallo, and Sister Mary Lawrence for their continuing work on this.

Join me also in thanking all who planned for and participated in **the celebrations of Advent and Christmas** in our parish. Whether in person or at home the beauty and character of these celebrations has greatly and gracefully contributed to our sure sense of togetherness as a faith community. For almost a year now — and probably for months yet to come — our faith has been and will continue to be the most important binding force of our parish life. I am most grateful for these parish leaders who work with so many others in preparing for and celebrating worship in our parish: Deacon George Watson, Theresa McWilliams, Joan Aslin, Lynda Brand, Anne Schwanz, Karen Kulla, Bob Seidel, and Pat Weise. Our parish liturgies are an essential element of the evangelizing activity of our parish.

As some of you may be aware, **Father Don Wester**, **Pastor of All Saints Parish** (St. Peters), is currently experiencing some pretty serious health issues. Father Don served the Catholic community here as Pastor of Our Lady of Good Counsel Parish for over 15 years. I am most grateful for the good work he did in this community, especially on behalf of our pastoral reorganization in 2005. His continuing support for the work of the Church in North County and care for the people of All Saints, where I most

recently served, is much appreciated. Here's a copy of the note he wrote to the parish last weekend. Let's keep him in our constant thoughts and prayers now and through all the days ahead. May he be blessed with exceptional care!

Dear Parish Family,

In the last few weeks I have been experiencing health challenges. I have needed aid in walking and my doctor has now advised that I do as little walking as possible. Of course, that limits my presence in our community, which I am missing greatly.

My symptoms are such that I not only have difficulty walking but I also have problems with numbness in my hands and fingers with little strength in my arms. The doctors have pinpointed some of the cause but not with a certainty of what they can recommend. I continue with various tests and I will keep you informed.

This time of year I'm usually sending out thank you notes. Please excuse any lack of response. My fingers aren't cooperating to do a personal note these days.

I know many of you are asking what you can do for me. In our community, that is an easy answer. Pray and pray! I will keep you in my prayers, as well.

finance committee report

### a new focus on evangelization

In December our Finance Committee (Bill Krenn, Donna Schlemmer, Mark Tranel, Marianne Scott, and Kim Staten) revived previous discussions on the need for a more formal and organized approach to evangelization in our parish.

Since the 2005 pastoral reorganization of our Deanery our parish has come to understand that we are a "mission parish with a mission". In this part of North County that mission is fundamentally one of "human development" which our Catholic Church understands to be "the work of helping every person and all people to achieve their

**fullest human potential"**. Several years ago as we began to work out this mission we identified and began to focus on three priorities:

Expanding our **Membership** 

by reimagining how we define, engage, and support those who belong.

Addressing the challenge of **Stewardship** by maximizing the investment of our human and material resources.

Cultivating new Partnerships

by inviting individuals and organizations to join us in the work of the Church in the communities we are here to serve.

For the past 15 years Christ Light of the Nations School has been a prime example of working with another parish and the Archdiocese to insure the vitality and stability of the mission of Catholic education and formation in this region. Since the closing of our school in May 2020, we have begun a discussion of how best to continue this evangelizing mission.

After exploring various options the Finance Committee decided with Father Mike to create a part-time **Evangelization Coordinator** position. Consultation on the vision, responsibilities, and organization of this position is now underway. We are hoping to fill the position by July 2021, if not before. In addition to parish funds, the annual distribution (generally about \$15,000) from the *Msgr*. *Poelker—Father Robertson Education Endowment* will be used to support the position, fulfilling the endowment's purpose of providing "financial support for the educational mission and ministries of Holy Name of Jesus Catholic Church, including, but not limited to, the elementary, adult and spiritual education of the members of the Parish".

The Committee also recommended that during the new year we begin to **more actively market partnership opportunities** with our parish. In particular, we intend to highlight the resources we bring to the table that could enhance the work of other non-profit organizations serving the needs of our community.

In 2014 parish leaders discussed with Father Mike and recommended designating an estate gift to the parish (\$155,000) as the **Pastoral Council Development Fund**. Grants would be made from this Fund by the Pastoral Council in support of our Partnership priority. At that time clear policy and protocol documents were developed with the belief that our location, our facilities, and our financial resources could be an asset to others who need and want to work in our community. This Fund would enable the Pastoral Council and parish leaders to take the initiative in the work of developing partnerships consistent with our parish mission and that of the Catholic Church. To date almost \$5,000 in grants have been awarded in support of outreach programs in our community.

We believe that **demonstrating our faith** in these and so many other ways **attracts people** and fulfills many of their daily, even desperate, prayers.

# rediscovering your enthusiasm a spiritual exercise

Right after New Years I received a letter from one of my former teachers. He writes regularly to family, friends, and former students. He's in his early 80s and thinks you're never to old to learn something new—or to be a teacher for those of any age. He likes thinking and talking about the public mission and ministry of Jesus, and most recently had this to say:

"What's important is that right from the beginning Jesus was not a soloist, but rather worked as part of a community. And to this very day, he continues to choose new disciples to carry on the work of God on Earth.

Invitations to join continue to be sent out. And the **big** question that each of us should ask is this:

Am I too being called to help in this great work of God, begun with Jesus and those first disciples?

Am I to be today's Peter or Andrew, Martha or Mary? Or to put it another way:

Does God need me to be a part of that great work of bringing greater love and service to the world that was God's intent right from the beginning?"

With this in mind I have a question for everyone. Today's Gospel suggests it and I invite you to spend a little time with it during the week ahead. Maybe even make a few notes here on any thoughts or feelings that come to mind.

### NAME SOMETHING ABOUT JESUS THAT YOU WOULD STAKE YOUR LIFE ON.

Hint: Your commitment to whatever this might be is often on your mind and evident to others. You have
"enthusiasm" about this, which literally means "to be possessed by God". You regularly sacrifice for this.)
Knowing what this is—and maybe other things about Jesus you're passionate about—means you also know what makes your faith most evident and attractive to others. Which then leads to this question:
HOW MIGHT YOU INVITE THEM FO 'STAY WITH YOU' FOR AWHILE?
