

an elementary connection

My brother-in-law, Joe, keeps a very large **Periodic Table of Elements** on the wall inside of their garage. He sees it every day. It's been there for years. It's an artifact from his teaching career, but over the years I've also thought of it as a kind of religious relic. It has a sacred and a scientific purpose as much as any other image we might be familiar with or value. Why? Because it's all about how the vital elements of the Earth are connected. A failure to understand these connections could be troublesome or even dangerous. More important, an appreciation of these elements often proves to be quite promising.

You have bound the human family to yourself
through Jesus, your Son, our redeemer.
You grant your people hope in Christ Jesus,
and a desire to be of service to all,
while they entrust themselves more fully
to the Holy Spirit.*

Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation I

I remember Joe telling me that it's gotten bigger over the years with new elements being discovered and created. So this week I spent a little time searching out the purpose of the Periodic Table. I learned that it's carefully organized. It's an **important reference** for scientists so they can **quickly recognize** the properties of individual elements

and their uniqueness. I learned that presently there are 118 elements of which about 25 are essential to life, especially human life. I was reminded that *Hydrogen* is the most important element and when combined with *Oxygen* makes Water. And most of us know the importance of being "**hydrated**". We need water to survive and thrive.

As you might suspect this quickly became another Lenten spiritual exercise. I created below a kind of periodic table for our life of faith. These are the basic characteristic elements of Christian faith. If you want to be a Christian or need to recognize such faith in another person, look for these elements that we too should **quickly recognize** and have an **important reference**. If you're thinking about your family and parish or your support for any kind of Christian organization or ministry, **ask yourself how evident are these elements?** The power of Christian love hinges on the strength of the combination of these essential elements.

On Easter we will renew our Baptismal promises. Lent may well be about "**re-hydrating**" ourselves spiritually for that day of recommitment. Even more for the day of Pentecost when the world around us once again ought to experience a renewed life-giving Church – the faith community of our parish continuing to share our life with all around us and exploring new ways of doing so.


