The Annual Catholic Appeal ends in our parish on **Monday, August 16th**. Again, I am most grateful and encouraged by the participation and generosity of our parishioners. Your gifts and pledges benefit our parish as well as enable our Church to accomplish great good across the whole Archdiocese.

community outreach

vaccination clinics continue

As you may be aware this summer our parish teamed up with the St. Louis County Department of Public Health to make Covid-19 vaccinations available in our community. County Health was especially surprised and very pleased with the success of these two clinics, with 53 shots administered on July 14th and 73 shots on August 4th. This past week our Vaccination Team met to review the organization of our effort and these outcomes. In addition to the number of shots received, we also had a strong base of volunteers to support this important initiative in our community.

With all this in mind, our Team recommended that we offer our site to County Health for four additional clinics between now and the end of the year. Once we have dates from the County, volunteers will be notified and scheduled. Again, we will publicize these clinics throughout the community and continue to encourage our parishioners to get the word out to their neighbors and their families. I'm most grateful to Joan Aslin, Bob & Pat Stolte, Mike & Laura Petroff, and Joe Vassallo, for their commitment and work on this project.

hospitality – the greatest

evangelizing virtue

I have long thought about “**virtues**” as “**characteristic strengths**” or “**strengths of character**”. These are the ways by which we are best known to others. Be Attentive—God promises to be with us at Mass. Listen and watch carefully. Participate. You will be rewarded.

Be Different—Resolve to leave church and be a different person. Mass is not magic, but it can and does change us when we put our minds to it and our hearts in it.



WHAT'S THE GOOD NEWS?

First, comes the call.

"Hi! How are you? How is your family?"

Then comes the response.

"We're making it. We're doing..."

Next the story.

"During this time my brother fell and broke his leg. He wouldn't let me call 911. I fussed with him. By nightfall he was in so much pain. Finally, he let me call 911. When they cut his pant leg, his leg was black and blue as well as swollen. They rushed him to the hospital. I'm running back and forth. This is in the middle of Covid and I had to fuss to be able to be with him. You know how he is."

My response.

My heart goes out to you. Your brother is not an easy person to live with. How do you make it? Where do you find the courage to keep on keeping on?

Questions open the door to a deeper conversation as a means of supporting and walking with the other person. The questions are asked not out of curiosity or plain nosiness, but as a means of the other person seeing how God is at work in their life.

By asking: "Hi! How are you? How is your family?" we open the door to give the Holy Spirit room to work. We are not God. We are tools in the hands of God instruments of drawing others closer to His Heart.




When we ask, we need to be willing to really listen. We need to open our heart and let the other person find a home there, if even for a brief time.

Why have an open heart? Why not think about what we want to say next? If we really desire to walk with Jesus, we need to have an open heart to receive other people. His Heart is Open. Our hearts need to be open.

Walking this way with others is **EVANGELIZATION**. We walk with Jesus who invites us to walk with our sister and brother at this moment. To answer the call is to fulfill our Baptismal Promises to share the GOOD NEWS.

What's the Good News? God is with us every moment of every day. When we walk with the other we see their God given dignity and honor them with the gifts of time and energy. We share this Good News by the gift of our presence. Who do you know needs a call? Needs to hear God's voice in and through you? Give them a call! Share the Good News!
