The St. Joseph Evangelization Radio Network this year established the first “**Woman of the Year, Heart of the Church**” award with the hope and intention of supporting the faith of all Catholics and inspiring the faith of future generations. This award is meant to acknowledge and recognize a faith-filled Catholic woman who has voluntarily given outstanding time and talent to our Church and Community.

The **Catholic Woman of the Year** is an individual of integrity who lives out her faith by sharing her time and talent for the good of others. The award is designed to shine a small spotlight on women who are so often humble, quiet, and reluctant heroes. It is meant to Inspire and encourage good works in all of us.

Awardees are nominated as individuals of integrity who live out their lives of faith by sharing their time and talent for the good of others. This year one of our parishioners, **Annette Bligh**, was nominated by the Archdiocesan Central Office of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and received this award at the Catholic Woman of the Year banquet dinner last Sunday evening.

Annette was nominated for “her dedication to her faith” and for her 13 years of “tireless service to her Neighbors in need” as a pastoral leader and member of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. “Annette has truly been the face of Christ to thousands of people these past number of years”.

Annette has been very active in visiting the homes of those in need across North City and County as a member of the Society. She has also served as conference president for both the Archdiocesan and District Councils. In addition, she has served as Utility Assistance Coordinator for the North District and volunteer chair of the St. Louis Council Disaster Relief Committee.

She credits her understanding of our mission to serve and the call to servant-leadership to her Catholic upbringing and education, and to a retreat she made in 2011.

Annette and her husband Marty are active members of our parish, married over 50 years. She continues to model well what it means to be a Catholic woman and mother for their 3 daughters. Her “joyful faith” and “humble, get-it-done personality ... inspires everyone she meets”. Marty received the St. Joseph award for men last year.

Service is a key characteristic of Catholic Christian identity. However it is that we serve the needs of others, we must constantly remember that our generosity and faith-filled care touches the lives of many more people than we could ever imagine.

After Annette was informed that she was being nominated for this award, she was invited to share some of her thoughts about our Catholic faith.

How each of us reveals the characteristic of ‘service’ in our lives is wonderfully different. May her words inspire and strengthen in all of us a continuing commitment to put our faith into action for the benefit and salvation of others.

“Serving the poor, making home visits and listening to our neighbors in need, drives me to volunteer for God and it makes me realize how blessed I am to serve.”

“Visiting neighbors, listening with compassion to their needs, and praying with people motivates me. Letting them know that God loves them and seeing the face of Jesus in them is my way of passing faith to the people I touch.”

“Being the Heart of the Church is a huge thing I never thought of. I am proud to be a Catholic and I could never imagine being anything else. When I am at Mass, I am mesmerized by the Eucharist. It doesn’t get any better than that.”




