a hopeful and glorious future what are you waiting for
thinking about the church
in a new way

The community of St. Mark clearly believes that Jesus, the Son of Man, will come in power and glory to gather the chosen into the fullness of an eternal life. What they don't yet know is that it may take a while to gather the chosen.

One clear and strong theme running through the Gospels is that Jesus came to show us **what it looks like to be a real human being**. For most of us it's the work of a life time. And remember, everyone on Earth is chosen. Which means, we're in this together. It's salvation history in the making. And I would now like to make the case that we're much more capable for this than we may think.

We heard proclaimed in today's Gospel these two verses:

"Learn a lesson from the fig tree. Once the sap of its branches runs high and it begins to sprout leaves, you know that summer is near."

I find in them **an affirmation of common sense** as well as **imaginary thinking**. More than likely most of us have learned a few life lessons simply by paying attention to nature around us. Practical lessons like knowing what to plant and where to plant, or the best times of day for fishing or hunting, or simply how good it is for the soul to get your hands dirty every once in a while.

Some how these things are **common sense** to us—a trust worthy store of knowledge and wisdom that makes our lives and our life together good and better. The community of St. Mark clearly remembers Jesus encouraging them to use common sense as **an evangelical principle** guiding them in the work of salvation—bringing every person and all creation back to God by the end of the world.

But, there's also another principle at work in these verses—**imaginary thinking**. They remember that Jesus wanted them to use the purpose of a fig tree and how it works as a way of thinking about the work of salvation, that is, the mission of the Church. As human being really come to life and their care for creation is all the more evident, we will be speechless at the glory of God. And we may know that the end of the world is near. At the very least that the Reign of God is upon us!

I believe that **the work of evangelization** requires **common sense** and **imaginary thinking**. I also believe that most everyone is quite capable of these things. We never needed permission for these things and our Church now needs them more than ever.

I encourage you to use the exercise below to explore your "**discipleship**" and your level of desire for bringing the Good News of Jesus Christ to others.

Today's Gospel reminds us that Christian faith is much more like a marathon than a sprint. One of the first and biggest changes that the early Church had to deal with was giving up on the expectation that the Second Coming was just around the corner. "**What are you waiting for**" was the **evangelical question** (?) and the **urgent proclamation** (!) of the day. Gratitude and generosity then became—and remain still today—the norm for a Christian life.

Soon we will begin the **Season of Advent**. I encourage you to use this exercise as one good way to enter into the coming **Year of Faith**. Simply circle "where you think you are right now" and then circle "where you want to be a year from now". Then, think about, pray about, and talk with someone you trust about how you will get there over the coming months of this new year. I promise you, it will be a glorious adventure!




