March 2022 Changes

## Covid Update

We are most grateful to you for how well everyone has tried to use their best judgment over these past two years, and for how well we have worked together to make things work out well for us here at church.

As you may be aware, we’re entering a new phase of the Covid-19 pandemic. It’s now being called an **“ENDEMIC”** which simply means that the virus is expected to be **PRESENT AT LOWER LEVELS IN OUR COMMUNITY AT ALL TIMES**. This also means that we can begin to normalize our response to this virus and make some welcome changes in how we go about protecting ourselves as a community.

This **DOES NOT MEAN** that it has been eradicated. However, with more people being vaccinated, paying attention to the positivity rate of infections may not be as important as the numbers of hospitalizations, ICU admissions, and deaths.

Currently our area of St. Louis County is at **MEDIUM RISK**. Therefore, **UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE** we are making the following changes for worship in our church or for other parish activities taking place in any of our facilities:

Masks are no longer **REQUIRED**, though all are encouraged to use good judgment, especially for the good of others.

Marks are highly **RECOMMENDED** for those at **HIGH RISK** for severe illness, including the unvaccinated of any age, those with chronic diseases (diabetes, heart disease, any illnesses that lowers the immune system), and anyone over 65.

We will continue the use of every other pew in church and **SOCIAL DISTANCING** practices for the foreseeable future.

We will continue to insure that there is **ADEQUATE VENTILATION** and fresh air circulation when we gather in our parish.

These practices will remain in place until we have achieved a constant **LOW RISK** condition in our area at which time they will be reviewed.

Especially now, it is **EXTREMELY IMPORTANT** for everyone to remember that if you are sick with anything, if you’re not feeling “right”, experiencing the fatigue or achiness like you’re getting a cold, then you **SHOULD STAY HOME. DO NOT COME TO CHURCH** or **PARTICIPATE** in other parish activities. And we urge you to seriously consider getting a Covid test.

Your continuing attention to these necessary disciplines – in our parish and our community – we help to insure the health and wellbeing of many and the continuing improvement of our parish life together here.



### EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

*Have you ever wanted a few uninterrupted minutes of quiet for prayer and thanksgiving?*

*What about time to talk with God about what is going on in your life or to ask for God's help and direction with a problem you are having?*

*Would you like to help us revive our Eucharistic adoration since covid?*

Eucharistic adoration is the spiritual practice of spending time in the presence of the exposed Host.

For Catholics, **the Eucharist is not a symbol of Jesus; we believe that the consecrated host is actually the Body, soul, and divinity of Christ.**

Eucharistic adoration gives us a chance to be with our God one on one. Through this practice, we're invited to spend time alone with our God and bring all our cares and concerns, prayers and thoughts to Him. God is the one you can spend time with without having to say anything. You can just share the moment and enjoy each other's company, knowing your relationship is deeper than the spoken word.

Whether you sign up for an hour before the blessed sacrament or just drop in for a few minutes on Adoration day, God is always happy to see you.

**Save this date. On Tuesday, April 5, at 6:30 in church,** we will be hosting a speaker, Patty Schneier, who will speak on the Eucharist and Eucharist Adoration.

Following that, we will begin sign-ups to once again have Eucharistic adoration in our parish.




