

koch foundation supports parish evangelization effort

This week I learned our parish has been awarded a \$10,000 grant from the Koch Foundation for the evangelization initiative which began in our parish in July 2021.

Once our proposal was accepted, the application process began in January 2021 under the direction of **Mark Tranel**, who serves on our parish Finance Committee. I also met with **Archbishop Rozanski** to talk about the importance of this initiative in our parish and to ask for his support for our grant application. He was most willing and happy to write a letter of recommendation.

In our parish this initiative intends to build on and expand the ways in which our parishioners encounter the love of Christ and our Church. Why? An **Evangelization Team** has been formed and you will soon be hearing more about the goals they have set for themselves and the ways each one of us can help to achieve them.

Please join me in thanking God and in asking God for continued blessings on this good work which God's grace has now begun in us!

Many Catholics throughout our Archdiocese, together with people around the world, share a great concern for the life and welfare of the Ukrainian people. It is hard to believe the tragedy of war taking place before our very eyes each day. It is hard to know what to do with our sorrow for them and our sense of helplessness.

Over the past few weeks Archbishop Rozanski has received many inquiries about ways to provide assistance. 
STEADFAST IN FAITH • FORWARD IN HOPE




**For a presentation on the Eucharist and
