



cultivating the power of prayer & vision of faith in our parish

Today we begin the celebrations of Holy Week, the most sacred time of year for all Christians. Our Catholic tradition invites us to participate in the mysteries of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. A most important form of participation has long been for us to gather in our church for the evening services of the Easter Triduum.

This year especially **gathering as a community** might truly be **the gift we need to share with each other** after the separations we've experienced from each other because of the pandemic.

So I want to encourage everyone to think about and talk with your family and friends about coming to church on **Thursday** (7:00pm), **Friday** (7:00pm), and **Saturday** (8:00pm) evenings this week. And we will celebrate Mass on **Easter Sunday** morning at 9:30am.

Saturday evening and Sunday morning celebrate the **foundation of Christian faith**, the **Resurrection** of the Lord Jesus. As you may be aware, this year on Saturday evening, we will receive into our Church through Baptism a new member, **Deborah Douglas**.

If it has been awhile since you've participated in a **Holy Saturday Easter Vigil** service, I would encourage you to do so this year.

Yes, it will be a **2-3 hour celebration**. But, **the experience of gathering** around the Easter fire, **celebrating** the great stories of our salvation, **witnessing** Deborah's baptism, and **supporting** her that night with the reaffirmation of our own faith, might be **for you** the experience of faith and community you've been looking for in your own life.

Every parish is characterized by its life of prayer, especially by their celebrations of the Eucharist. I am most grateful to our Liturgy Committee for their year round attention to

planning and organizing all that is needed for the celebration of Mass in our parish. I'm grateful as well for all who serve in our liturgical ministries and for the very evident participation of our parishioners.

Prayer is powerful. We want to believe this and hopefully we've all had some experience of how true it is. We are so often reminded in Scripture that **the vision of faith—seeing things with the eyes of God**—is cultivated in a life of prayer. Consider these ways in which you might cultivate your life of prayer:

- Look for ways of **attending Mass** as often as possible, on the weekend and during the week.
- We are now in the process of rebuilding our practice of **Eucharistic adoration**. Volunteer to participate regularly or plan to drop by for a visit often.
- Participate in our Tuesday morning **devotions** after Mass and other **planned services** throughout the year.
- Join us for our monthly **Candlelight Community Peace Vigil** on the last Sunday evening of the month.



Church Decorating


We will be decorating our church for the Easter season on Holy Saturday, April 16th, after 8:00am morning prayer. Any help is most welcome!
