

I want to thank everyone who participated in the recent parish survey. The combined results from this survey will form a major part of a workbook our Team will receive later this spring. This **survey** along with **demographic information** we have on our parish and our **vision** for the work of the Church in this region will help a lot as we plan for the future and prepare for listening sessions in our parish this fall.

Our participation in the survey was quite good, with a total of **160 surveys completed** representing **18%** of members in our parish directory and possibly **97%** of our average Mass attendance (165, October 2021).




