Beginning with the Season of Advent in 2020 we began to live stream our Sunday Mass for our parishioners.

As I am sure you well remember, this was at a time when many were not able to attend Mass in person because of community wide restrictions or their personal choice to be safe from the Covid-19 virus. After the re-opening of churches for worship earlier in the year, this was **an important step in the direction of reconnecting our members with each other** for the celebration of Mass.

Join me in thanking **Theresa McWilliams**, with the technical assistance of her son, **Matthew**, for taking the initiative to get this started and for managing problems as they occurred. She also worked with **Karen Kulla** and **Greg Warnusz**, assisting them to learn the set up and operation of the system so that it would be a shared responsibility.

I must say that we have learned quite a lot through this experience. However, as we have tracked the use of streaming Mass for our parish, we have noticed for a while now fewer people are using the service, currently 5 to 10 each weekend. We have also noticed **another important step has occurred—more people are returning for Mass** in our parish church.

Therefore, **we will no longer live stream the Sunday celebration of Mass** in our parish beginning this weekend. For those who may need this service, here are several options you may want to consider:


