an expert in our midst

who is yolanda wade?

Yolanda Wade spent two decades in the Navy and she has a Master's degree in criminal justice with an emphasis in homeland security. In 2019 she worked for Boeing in St. Louis, but when she lived in Denver she says God moved her to volunteer to examine her church's security.

*"I saw the need.
God placed it on my heart and
I just started doing it.
It was just a desire
to want to do more for the kingdom."*

Visiting churches she saw different vulnerabilities and didn't feel safe. She started reading about different attacks happening in other churches around the world. She was concerned that it could happen here. Churches are soft targets and must think about their security on a larger scale.



Yolanda is now conducting research for her dissertation for a Doctor of Management degree in Homeland Security. She first contacted me in early April and soon after I was encouraged by

a neighboring Christian pastor to participate. Her focus is on examining the strength of the security practices of faith-based organizations in St. Louis County. She hopes to reduce the likelihood of intruder or active shooter incidents by determining their level of preparedness.

In April, I completed an initial written security survey followed by an interview in July concerning our current situation and level of organization and readiness.

securing our presence

why has she come to us?

When she's invited to do a security assessment she looks at everything from the ground up. Her review will consider building security and parking lots; best practices for how money is safeguarded and employees are screened; and our preparedness for a disaster, an intruder, or active shooter incident.

Within our Archdiocese the current situation might be summarized in the follow way. Over the past 30 years comprehensive employment policies and procedures governing screening, background checks, and training for all employees and volunteers have been put in place and are being administered on a regular basis.

Parish financial and internal control audits are regularly undertaken by the Archdiocese. Also, building and property safety risk assessments take place every other year, though only giving occasional attention to security issues.

All Catholic elementary and secondary schools have well-development safety and security plans as well as regular training for administrators, teachers, and staff.

benefits to our parish

what can we expect?

Our participation in this security assessment means that we are willing to look for our vulnerabilities and then to address them in a reasonable and responsible way. There is no financial cost to us for participating in this study. With 30 years of experience in intelligence work and with the faith-based security community, Yolanda's work with us this fall will be a resource hard to put a value on.

Our willingness to participate in this study might especially benefit our parish after its completion. She is willing to volunteer her security services to conduct follow-up risk assessment and training for us, if we are interested.

She will do a report after her assessment which will be submitted to the parish pastoral staff and parish leaders for review. This might be especially helpful to us as we identify those protocols and procedures which ought to be a part of a written security plan for our parish.

Over the years our parishioners, parish leaders, and staff have become much more conscious of safety issues. This awareness of our vulnerability confirms our need for a plan as well as for our staff and volunteers to be trained for putting that plan into practice. This awareness also means utilizing the resources of the Archdiocese or requesting any assistance that currently does not exist for parishes.

I'm sure there's not one of us who doesn't want to move confidently into the future ahead of us. We have a clear responsibility to one another as parishioners and to the organizations who partner with us in the work of our Catholic Church. This is an opportunity to act on our awareness of the importance of safety and security




