



father mike

a theology of protest speaking up & acting out

Many parables of Jesus—including today's scene involving a persistent widow and a dishonest judge—have been passed down to us as stories told or acted out in the streets quite publicly. Jesus wants everyone to see and hear exactly what he means by the “reign of God” on Earth—often to the embarrassment of his disciples and the delight of the crowd.

“The decision of Jesus to preach involved a decision to move into the world of the imagination, where the battle for the human heart is won or lost.”

With this parable—as is so often the case—there’s more meaning than you might think. The Hebrew word for “widow” really means “silent one”. The circumstances of widows often left them silent, but the use of the word “widow” was generally understood as symbolizing anyone who is “exploited” or “oppressed”.

This widow, however, is far from silent. She **publicly speaks up** and **acts out** her protest over **justice delayed** which so often becomes **justice denied**. Strangely, Luke’s Jesus also wants us to pay attention to the dishonest judge. He moves away from his careless attitude because she stands her ground.

The “widow” always walks that very thin line between making someone’s life “uncomfortable” in a way that’s designed to trigger greater self-awareness, even when the other person may perceive their life as being “threatened”.

The point of the parable: Don’t quit if you know you’re right! Or as the old saying goes, “If at first you don’t succeed, try and try again!”

i was an evangelizer today . . .

As I read many of the cards in the back of church, I was reminded of this. Those on the receiving end of your words and actions often will **presume you’re a good human being**. But we want them to know more than that.

Tell people “why” you say or do something by sharing the Bible story that inspires you, the trait in Jesus life that challenges you, or the saint that gives you encouragement. Answer the “why” question, even when they don’t ask it. Then they’ll know they’ve also encountered another Christ.


