the art of living in a **both/and world on earth today**

Reflecting on this week's Gospel, I found myself asking, "**Which would be easier?**" "To live in an '**either/or**' type of world? Or, to live in a world where '**both/and**' was more characteristic in our daily life together?"

The **undercurrent** present in today's Gospel is quite **strong**. Eventually it's a **deadly** one for Jesus.

Clearly **the party of the Sadducees** prefers the tidiness and seeming certainty of **an "either/or" position**. If you want an ordered life in this world (*It's the only world we have!*), if you want a stable life for your family and community (*Isn't that what matters most!*), then **two things cannot be true at the same time**.

"Listening means being able to share questions and doubts, to journey side by side, to banish all claims to absolute power and to put our abilities and gifts at the service of the common good."

For the Sadducees, the written Word of God is The Truth about everything. If you don't find it in Scripture (Torah), then it can't be true. They've long concluded there is no resurrection from the dead. Now they create a theoretical—and silly—argument with Jesus trying to prove their point against him.

For Jesus—and the Christian community of St. Luke—the written Word of God is True. But, from Jesus they're learning the value of a "**both/and**" attitude in life.

Often in Scripture the truth of the Word of God brings those who trust God to moments of **insight, courageous action, and commitment**. And, in the real lives of believers Scripture helps us to know more truth, deeper truth, and tested truth.

This is an evidence that **there is infinitely more truth in the world than we could ever imagine**.

The Truth of Scripture and the Truth of a life of faith well-lived! Jesus also then demonstrates from Scripture (Torah) that truth is boundless and timeless, and that resurrection has been, is now and will be forever. **Without a "both/and" attitude most people missed—and still do—the resurrection of Jesus.**

what we have learned about **the mystery of dying & rising**

This mystery is about change and it can't be an "**either/or**" mystery. Change happens, often it's our choice, but it can't be "**either**" we do change "**or**" we don't. Pretty much we all know that change is a part of life. Without change we die and experience only half of the mystery.

Everyone knows—if you think about it, even pray about it—this mystery is a "**both/and**" mystery. Change by choice or circumstance always involves "**both**" dying in some way "**and**" coming to another kind of life.

Earlier this year we gathered some **evidence** from the past 18 years of our lived experience as a parish that **change** has **positive value** and **beneficial outcomes** even when it may be challenging or painful.

A revitalization of active participation and lay leadership in parish ministries, organizations, and activities vital to parish life, welfare, and mission.

Members were invited to **explore** their **diverse parish experiences** and **create a future** with new ideas, talents, and more opportunities for service.

A redefinition of our parish mission that affirms the importance of the importance of the **visibility** and **credibility** of the Catholic Church in this community.

A commitment to sustain intentional and consistent strategic planning necessary for worship, social ministries, and evangelization.

A practical understanding of evangelization as "accompaniment" of others & "human development" that enables all persons to achieve their fullest human Potential.

A financial stability that values **regional collaboration** around clearly stated pastoral goals and **partnerships** with Archdiocesan offices and ministries

The *All Things New* strategic pastoral planning initiative now gives our parish an important opportunity once again to give attention to **evaluating our effectiveness** and **identifying opportunities** for improvement.

I encourage our members to remember these **positive values** and **beneficial outcomes** as we once again find ourselves—and our Church—within the mystery of resurrection. The first disciples seemed quite unrestrained in sharing such good news with others. Once again I encourage you to find a way of doing so ourselves now—with each other and across the Archdiocese.

The St. Vincent de Paul Conference at Holy Name of Jesus would like to give parishioners a financial report of the activities at the end of fiscal year 2022. As in the past two years during the Pandemic, the food pantry remained open. We were able to serve 636 Families at the value of \$59,500 worth of donated food and other health care and cleaning supplies.

Our phone team receives hundreds of calls each week. The largest percentage of calls are for utility assistance. At the beginning of our fiscal year, October 1, 2022 our beginning balance was \$21,927.76. We received financial donations from several St. Vincent de Paul Conferences. With their twinning and your generosity thru the conference envelopes, our income for 2022 was \$107,254.02. We were able to assist 3,944 people with \$115,633.94 leaving a balance of \$13,547.84.

The members of the conference would like to thank you all for your generosity and support. We could not serve our neighbors without you.

If you would like to learn more about our conference, members will be in back of church after Masses on November 5 and 6.

the 3rd booster or the 5th shot).




