



insights on living with the unexpected future

My creative writing teacher in high school drilled into our class over two semesters the following principle: **“Begin with the end in mind.”** That always seemed to help with building a plot line (*How am I going to get to the end?*) and developing a whole range of real or imagined characters (*Who is going to make the end of the story possible? Who might get in the way?*).

Our scriptures are often like that too. Whether it be a creation story or a redemption story—and the Bible is full of them—we believe that God always has the end of the story in mind before the content and characters appear.

Members of the early Church thought that the story of Jesus was going to be a one act play. As it turned out for them—and for us as we well know—the story of Jesus is a dramatic series over many seasons. Jesus promised that the Reign of God would come. He had the end in mind. But the cast of character was bigger and the story longer than they could imagine.

As we continue through the *All Things New* planning process the story line we are hoping to create will develop new themes and more characters around the classic elements of the Christian story.

We are focusing our energy and talent on—

Evangelization—Our Catholic Church has Good News to share with everyone. Our joy needs to be evident.

Pastoral Care—Our Catholic Church is deeply caring and compassionate for the human and spiritual needs of everyone. Our love is Christ-like and credible.

Leadership—Our Catholic Church expresses clearly the complementarity of clergy and lay leaders. Our baptism grounds the authority of our faith.

Stewardship—Our Catholic Church invests wisely in long term ministries that make a difference. Our hope needs to be promising for all who know us.

history in the making join our writing team

Whether or not you were able to attend one of the recent *All Things New* Parish Listening Sessions, we want you to **know the story** of what was presented there and to **be a part of writing the story of our future Church.**

We want you to think about how the cast of characters might need to change. What new story lines need to begin. The ending will be the same as its always been—the Reign of God now and forever. But the story needs to be refreshed for new readers to enjoy and more writers who might want to join our team.

If you’re interested in this writing project, go to our parish website—www.holynamestlouis.org—and click on the link titled **Post Listening Session Survey**. You’ll find all the material that was presented as well as your feedback survey. Please help us write a few more chapters into the life and work of our Catholic Church.

Some of the **discussion highlights** among the writers who gathered for our Listening Sessions included:

A **strong consensus** that the first set of models for parish reorganization were not adequate for the future of the story of our Church. No one wanted to be doing this all over again in five years! Ours is a classic story that needs to aim for stability—retelling in a lasting way!

A **sensible energy** that the Church in our area could be stronger and make a greater difference, if we thought of ourselves as one Church across the entire region of North County. This might even suggest one or two parishes only so that we might better capture and direct the story’s energy and outcomes. Even with a large, diverse cast of characters, we need to know that we are in this together.

Several **strong comments expressed** concern that Interstate 270 has become too much of a dividing line that separates communities which are distinctly different economically, racially, and culturally. If the work of salvation is bringing ourselves, each other, and all creation back to God, then nothing should get in the way of our being Good News across North County.

Other **expressed concerns** included how our 10 parishes might provide for worship and faith formation in the future as well as expand parish ministries that would address the human and spiritual needs of more people living in our region. Our reorganization—how we write and tell a new story—needs to kindle “a fire” of enthusiasm for social concern and evangelization.

National Black History Month

This week we high-light **Sister Thea Bowman, FSPA**

Educator, Missionary Disciple, Advocate for Cultural Awareness and Racial Harmony

Thea Bowman, was the only child born to middle-aged parents, Dr. Theon Bowman, a physician and Mary Esther Bowman, a teacher. At birth she was given the name Bertha Elizabeth Bowman. She was born in 1937 and reared in Canton, Mississippi. As a child she grew up protestant until at the age of nine, when she asked her parents if she could become Catholic. She converted to Catholicism through the inspiration of the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration and the Missionary Servants of the Most Holy Trinity who were her teachers and pastors at Holy Child Jesus Church and School in Canton. These religious communities nurtured her faith and greatly influenced her religious vocation. Thea Bowman passed away on March 30, 1990.

Gifted with a brilliant mind, beautiful voice and a dynamic personality, Sister Thea shared the message of God's love through a teaching career. After 16 years of teaching, at the elementary, secondary and university level, the bishop of Jackson, Mississippi, invited her to become the consultant for intercultural awareness. In her role as consultant Sister Thea, an African American, gave presentations across the country; lively gatherings that combined singing, gospel preaching, prayer and storytelling. Her programs were directed to break down racial and cultural barriers. She encouraged people to communicate with one another so that they could understand other cultures and races.
