

steadfast in faith * forward in hope

Happy New Year! May our frequent greeting to one another these days be both a prayer and a promise that with God's help we will do all that we can to be so blessed—each and every day! "*Attitude is everything*"! More than a few of my teachers have told me over all the years. And for the most part I've discovered how right they are.

And even more, "*We walk by faith, not by sight*"! Many, many of our parishioners have known the promising truth of this verse proclaimed by St. Paul. We can't always see exactly where we're going, how we will get there, or when a promise might be fulfilled. But, we also know that in the company of others who believe in God and those who strive to be Christ-like, we have found comfort and courage to carry on.

For those who have tried to live many years by faith and by attention to good attitude, there is one particular virtue that we will need to claim and cultivate during this new year. The **virtue of calmness**. Evidence of this virtue can be found in those moments of confusion or calamity when almost by second nature we knew what to do and did it with confidence. It's evident whenever someone thanks you for your patience or for being a good listener. It's also the fruit of wisdom that so often underlies good judgment and hope for the future.

This year we will get our first glimpse at **All Things New**—the who, what, why, when, and where of our Catholic Church and parish community for the coming years. This coming future Church will require the calmness born of our experience and wisdom. This year Catholics and their parish leaders will gradually and carefully begin to design and put into place the foundation of a new Church focused on evangelization and social concern for the needs of our community.

With this in mind, I would invite everyone to **clip & save this bulletin page**. Have it handy in the place where you pray. Reflect on the following texts that have guided this important and good work from the beginning.

From the Book of Revelation 21: 3-5

I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "*Behold, God's dwelling is with the human race. He will dwell with them and they will be his people and God himself will always be with them. He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there shall be no more death or mourning, wailing or pain, the old order has passed away.*"

The one who sat on the throne said, "*Behold, I make all things new.*" Then he said, "*Write these words down, for they are trustworthy and true.*"

Evangelii Gaudium ("Joy of the Gospel" Pope Francis) (27)

I dream of a "**missionary option**", that is, a **missionary impulse** capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be **suitably channeled for the evangelization of today's world** rather than for her self-preservation.

The **renewal of structures** demanded by pastoral conversion can only be understood in this light: as part of **an effort to make them more mission-oriented, to make ordinary pastoral activity on every level more inclusive and open, to inspire in pastoral workers a constant desire to go forth** and in this way to elicit a positive response from all those whom Jesus summons to friendship with himself.

As John Paul II once said to the Bishops of Oceania: "*All renewal in the Church must have mission as its goal if it is not to fall prey to a kind of ecclesial introversion*".
