

believing in our future the promise of a real presence

As we continue our journey of faith this year through **All Things New**, it is important to remember that we have received much valuable feedback from our parish and from parishes across our region. Parish listening sessions, qualitative and quantitative on-line and paper surveys, and free form comments have been summarized.

These **summaries will be available to our parishioners beginning January 19th** on the *All Things New* website.

This week our parish **ATN Team** will review and validate these summaries for the **Archdiocesan Planning Team** who on **January 23rd begin their work of “re-modeling”** the first set of models for reorganization.

Further consideration of these models then begins on **February 2nd** when the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council and all Archdiocesan priests will review and discuss any proposed revisions. Then, **ATN Parish Leadership Teams** in our planning area will meet on **February 8th** to review and discuss any and all proposed future configurations of our parishes. Soon after this the second draft of proposed models for reorganization they will be available to all parishioners on the ATN website.

In our own parish, I have planned a series of four meetings with our **Parish Pastoral Leadership Council** beginning on **January 26th** through **March 23rd**, designed to support their roles in the coming transition of our parish and reorganization of our Catholic Church in North County.

believing in the real presence trusting what is

For years I've kept the poem below in my Bible. It marks for me the **last mystery of the childhood of Jesus**—his being lost and found in the Temple. Maryknoll Father Joseph Veneroso captures well the cycle of desperate fears and joyful relief that must have been a frequent part of Joseph and Mary's family life together. A young child's curiosity about his or her life always creates a certain amount of good trouble.

We all truly know something about this. The experience of Joseph and Mary "**losing Jesus**" is not foreign to most of us. As too I hope is their sense of the discovery of his real presence once again in their lives. This pattern of "losing" and "finding" is characteristics in anyone's life of faith.

This last of the Christmas cycle of stories might also teach us something more. Jesus' growing curiosity about himself led him to "**get lost**" in the Temple. Eventually Jesus "**got found**" by his panic-stricken parents in the Temple. And aren't we all just a little bit haunted by the evangelist's Jesus question to his parents, "**Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?**"

Possibly a reminder to every disciple and future apostle that if you're **curious about who you really are or upset by the seeming absence of God in your life**, maybe try **putting yourself in some kind of a sacred space**. Maybe our parish church for a weekday Mass or Eucharistic adoration or just 2 to 3 minutes of "mindfulness" during the day that we live in the presence of God always.
