creating a new winning script acting out the word of God

There is a basic principle in human psychology that the **human will operates only through attractive images**. It's a principle that both God and Madison Avenue know very well!

Images are capable of conveying **powerful insights** which shed light on human goodness as well as the problem of evil in our world. All of the evangelists capture how well Jesus was at using **images as a primary tool** in his preaching and teaching.

Today's Gospel uses the very familiar images of "light" and "salt". The evangelist remembers Jesus inviting disciples and anyone who's listening to **re-write the script of their lives** under the guiding power of these images.

Since last fall in various ways we have been **listening** and **gathering** the ideas, feelings, and images of our parishioners concerning the *All Things New* reorganization of parishes. Why? Because we want our Catholic Church to be more visible, more credible, and more engaged in the **evangelical and social mission** of Christ—in our region and across the Archdiocese. In a sense, **we are re-writing the script of the story for what parish life will look like for generations to come**.

Recently, a team of nearly 50 volunteers, including religious orders, Kenrick-Glennon Seminary faculty and staff, associate pastors, permanent deacons and lay people summarized all the information received from 178 parishes during the *All Things New* pastoral planning initiative. Feedback came from key parish leaders, parish listening sessions, online surveys, individual letters and emails.

These summaries will be important as Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski makes a well-informed, prayerful final decision on the pastoral and spiritual wellbeing of the Archdiocese.

The **All Things New** Planning Team has refined the draft models to one model per planning area. Using the feedback summaries, parish workbooks and financial data, the Team analyzed each model to ensure they have the resources to sustain the renewed organization. In **February** more feedback will be gathered from parish leaders and more information will be considered, including redrawing maps of parishes and priest assignments

By the end of April, Archbishop Rozanski will have met with Consultors to review final draft models. He will then have a month of prayer and reflection before announcing a final decision on May 28, the Feast of Pentecost. Implementation of these plans will take effect beginning in fall 2023 through 2026.

Please continue to pray for the gift of true discernment in everyone's life so that we may continue to do the Will of God in all things.

writing guidelines parish feedback summary

All **Parish Feedback Summaries** were written by volunteers were asked to follow **four guidelines**: that they—

- offer a fair representation of what people said;
- include the real contradictions and tensions reflected in the feedback;
- offer the good ideas and key insights shared; and
- ensure they are concise.

Volunteers were not allowed to synthesize any information for parishes in their own planning area.

The **initial draft** of our Parish Feedback Summary was sent to Father Mike, who shared the summary with our **All Things New Key Parish Leaders** (Mark Tranel, Pet Warnusz, Mary Meredith, and Sr. Mary Lawrence) and with our **Pastoral Leadership Team** who provided feedback on the initial draft. Our feedback (concerning deletions and additions) was substantially included in the final summary report.




