

refining models for the future your feedback is making a difference

Last October the first draft models of parish structures were circulated for your consideration. These were unfinished because we needed your insight and feedback for which we thank you. You were prayerful, thoughtful, passionate, and candid. Archdiocesan planners were challenged to be more creative, and they took notes. We were heard!

As a result, all the planning area draft models have changed because parishioners across the Archdiocese shared about their parishes and their lived experience of the Catholic faith. Feedback on what parishes, ministries, and institutions need to look like to **effectively share the faith** in a way that is **suitable** and **sustainable** for our children, grandchildren, and generations to come.

We gathered feedback about which communities it made sense to bring together under the care of one pastor. In addition to the feedback we received on parish models—

- 70,000** completed the **Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Survey**
- 350 Listening Sessions** were hosted at **178** parishes,
- 18,000** parish school parents, administrators, teachers, staff, donors, community partners, and volunteers were surveyed
- Statistics** on parishes and schools compiled
- Meetings** with community, civic, and business organizations
- Special Ministry Focus Groups** in deaneries and parishes

The **2nd Draft Models** reflect the input received from priests, deacons, religious, key parish leaders, and parishioners. The models show the Archdiocese being reshaped from **178 individual parish pastorates** into **88 pastorates** in order to more effectively accomplish the work of the Church. The *All Things New* Planning Committee has analyzed each pastorate to ensure each one has the resources to sustain a new territory and model of ministry.

looking to our future what is a “pastorate”?

Since the beginning of *All Things New* all of our efforts and activity has been **focused on one driving question**: *Which communities does it make most sense to have come together in light of demographic shifts, evangelization and social outreach efforts, resources, and priest availability?*

Our Church has long had a word for a community like this: **“Pastorate”**. This word means, **“a community entrusted to the pastoral care of one pastor and a pastoral team and staff which may include one or several other priests, deacons, and lay pastoral leaders”**.

The *All Things New* process of “re-modeling” or “reimagining” our parishes has been progressively working toward **suitable** and **sustainable “pastorates”** in our Archdiocese structured in one of the following ways:

An Individual Parish – Recommendations now propose that 48 of the 178 parish we have in our Archdiocese will **remain their own “pastorates”**. However, they may have to adapt some of their ministries and Mass times due to priest availability. They too must stay focused on the Archdiocesan priorities of evangelization and social concern.

Current recommendations further envision the remaining 130 parishes we now have becoming 40 “pastorates” **organized** in one of the following ways:

A Multiple Parish Union – This “pastorate” would be **two or more parishes** sharing one pastor as well as a pastoral team and staff with **each parish remaining canonically and financially independent** of each other. However, progressively local leaders will strive to collaborate and cooperate so that the Catholic Church achieves the vision of being visible, credible, and engaged in every region of the Archdiocese.

A Merged Parish – This “pastorate” envisions **two or more parishes combining their resources** with one pastor, pastoral team, and staff now serving one faith community.

Final review and feedback on models from parishioners will help Archdiocesan planners begin a case-by-case examination of which structure works best for each existing parish.

No matter the chosen structure, local leaders may need to be decided if a worship site still needs to be used in the future or may need to be replaced.
