



Since July 2017, I have served on the **Advisory Council** for the *Pathways to Progress* partnership initiative working out of our Parish Community Center. Currently *Pathways* is expanding their staff and program services and carefully managing their growth into the future. This will take place under the leadership of a new **Program Director** whose knowledge, skill, and experience will focus on those external relationships and shared services that will enable *Pathways* to build on the work of the past 6 years.

At the last meeting of the Advisory Council, the current interim Director reported that soon the number of **Member Advisors** (case workers) would be expanding from 6 to 8. In addition, 2 new positions have been created—an **Assistant Director** and a **Supervisor for Member Advisors**. It was also reported that—

13 Member Families graduated in September 2022

A total of **28 Member Families** graduated since 2017

12 Families are currently on a wait list or being screened

Outcomes During 2022 include—

86 Member Households are now being served including **230 Children** who have been especially affected by the challenges of social isolation and school problems brought on by the Covid 19 pandemic but with **52.5%** now functioning at higher learning levels

Outcomes During 2022 continued—

61 (71%) Members employed with program assistance for challenge of getting / keeping jobs

68 (78%) Members improved their housing

91% of Members improved their job skills

76 (88%) Members improved bills / savings

Pathways success is rooted in the commitment to growth and change Members make and the equally faithful commitment of the *Initiative* to find, guide, and support them with all the services they need to succeed. Please keep this partnership in your prayers. Slowly but quite surely it is bringing stability to families and our community.

parish level social concern what is pathways?

Pathways to Progress is an initiative of **St. Francis Community Services** an agency of **Catholic Charities St. Louis**.

Pathways strives to strengthen our community by helping families increase their ability—

- to live safe, productive, and sustainable lives;**
- to make effective decisions** that positively impact their future; and
- to advocate** for systemic and progressive change in support of their stability and long-term economic independence.

Member families commit themselves to effectively utilizing *Pathways'* services in order to break the cycle of poverty in their lives now – and for the sake of their children in the future.

Pathways is built on a **shared service model**. This means that it's real strength lies not only in its internal organization and operations, but also in its partnerships with other faith-based outreach agencies and church sponsored services within our Archdiocese and wider community.

With the success of *Pathways* and looking to the future of *All Things New*, Catholic Charities is currently considering how it might restructure its organization and services in order to **enhance effective, parish based interaction with people in need**. In doing so they too are striving to address the Archdiocesan priorities of evangelization and social outreach—hallmarks of our future as a Catholic Church.



Celebrating The Sacrament of Reconciliation

Periodically it is good for us all to remember that this very day there is not an “**unredeemed**” person, place, or situation on the face of the Earth. Jesus has died and is risen for sinners “**once and for all**”, everywhere and for all time! This is the real freedom Christ wants us to know in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The Risen Christ needs us to have this kind of freedom. And when we have it, we will be especially good at the yet unfinished work of “**salvation**” which is always best understood as: “*bringing ourselves, all others, and every thing of creation back to God at least as good as it was in the beginning*”.

If you feel comfortable and have a pen, sign your name now and drop the slip in the collection basket today or bring one back next week. There is also a card in the bulletin that you can return.


Walking in the Footsteps of Jesus
