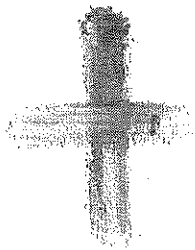

Celebrating The Sacrament of Reconciliation

Periodically it is good for us all to remember that this very day there is not an **“unredeemed”** person, place, or situation on the face of the Earth. Jesus has died and is risen for sinners **“once and for all”**, everywhere and for all time! This is the real freedom Christ wants us to know in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The Risen Christ needs us to have this kind of freedom. And when we have it, we will be especially good at the yet unfinished work of **“salvation”** which is always best understood as: *“bringing ourselves, all others, and every thing of creation back to God at least as good as it was in the beginning”*.

If it's been a while since last you experienced this Sacrament, come and see what grace God might have in mind for you now. It's important to know you've been **“redeemed”**. It's even more important to know that you're an **“instrument of salvation”**. And all of this is well worth celebrating with someone else.

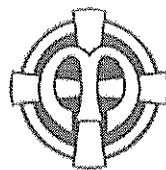
