

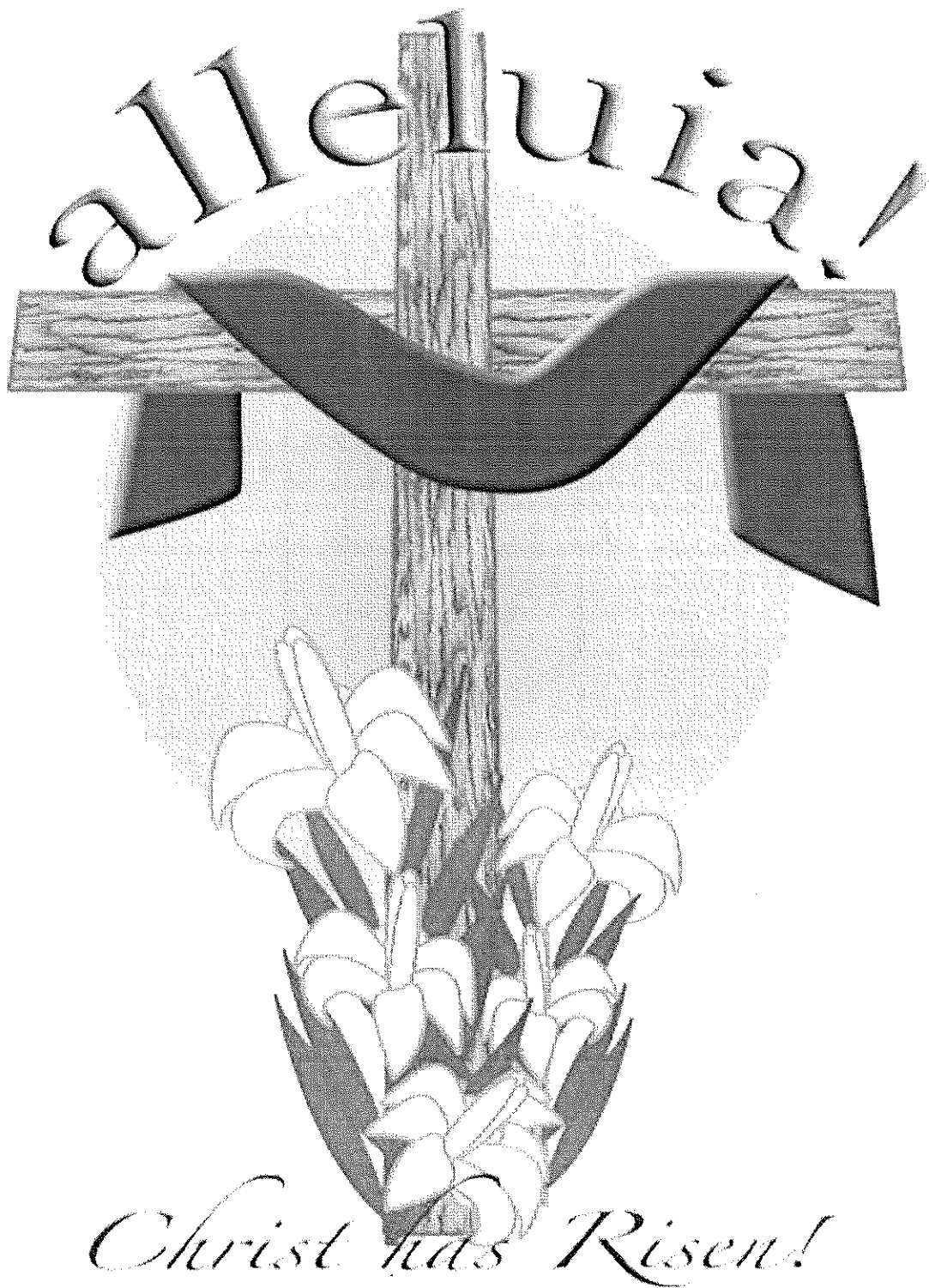

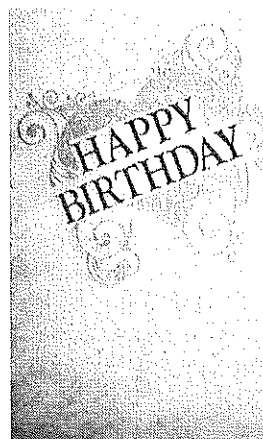
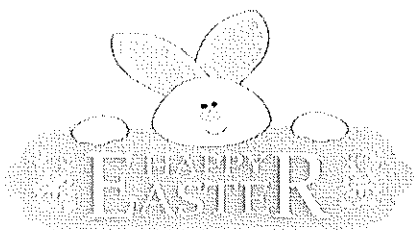

All are welcome.



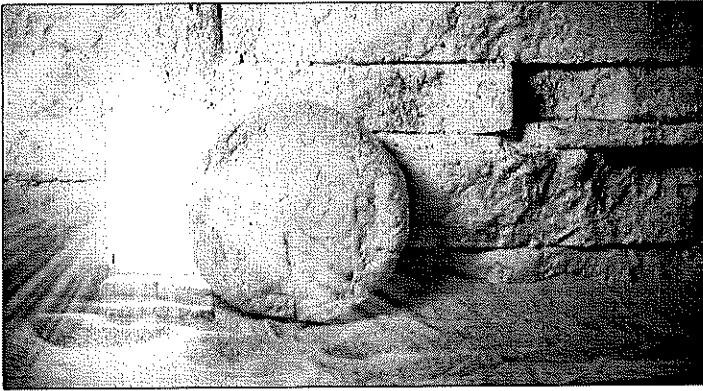

Already in the Advent prophecies of Zachariah upon the birth of John the Baptist, St. Luke foresees the meaning and the purpose of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Namely, the promise and the reality of there being more “**tender compassion**” in our world.

Every human being is capable of living this way. Many of us have even experienced the power of such **an attitude toward the world around us**—either on the receiving end or in the giving. There is less darkness in peoples’ lives when there is tender compassion. There is more light, more hope. Zachariah’s prophecy is timeless. As much about Easter as Christmas. Therefore, during the Easter Season
