



Years ago the Microsoft Corporation adopted this question as its motto. Archbishop Rozanski recently wrote in the I've always found it carries both an invitation and an excitement that reminds me of one of my favorite Biblical heroes—Abraham. Even on the worst day of his life—when God tests his faith beyond belief in asking for the sacrifice of his only son—unknowingly he responds to God's call with "Ready"! I have found that the process of All Things New requires the faith of Abraham. As we begin the years of implementation the parishes of the Church of St. Louis are being called to reevaluate their current pastoral care, social outreach, and evangelization efforts to see how they can be refined or reinvented, even those parishes where there is no change of pastors or to the parish structure.

Celebrating the Feast of Corpus Christi it's good for us to remember that Paul's experience of the Risen Jesus cultivated a strong sense of communion with all other people. He found at the table of the Lord an energy—a "readiness"—for the work of salvation. In this we will always have a future well worth looking forward to ourselves.





St Ferdinand 57th Annual **Memorial Golf Tournament**


