

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Laudetur Jesus Christus, In Saecula saeculorum! As we gather on this 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, the readings prompt us to contemplate the art of fraternal correction. In Ezekiel 33:7-9, we are reminded of the duty of appointed leaders to guide wrongdoers towards reform. Likewise, Romans 13:8-10 calls us to love our neighbors and refrain from causing harm. The Gospel of Matthew (18:15-20) emphasizes the responsibility of Christians to correct those who have erred, while also highlighting the importance of approaching this task in a proper manner.

Now, let me share a personal struggle I have with these readings. At first glance, it may seem like they endorse criticizing and confronting those who have wronged us or our loved ones. There's a certain satisfaction in calling people out, pointing out their faults, and making them feel inferior. However, upon deeper reflection, I realize that this interpretation cannot be correct. The flaw lies in assuming that we are the ones who have been wronged, the morally superior ones entitled to confront others. This presumption is spiritually dangerous.

To truly grasp the essence of these readings, we must reverse our perspective and see ourselves as the sinners, the ones who have wronged others. When we put ourselves in the shoes of the one being confronted, we recognize that criticism often triggers anger, defensiveness, and resentment. It rarely achieves the desired outcome and often exacerbates the situation. So, how do we navigate this delicate territory without causing more harm?

Firstly, we must empathize and imagine how we would feel if someone said the same things to us. Would we be receptive to their words? **Secondly**, we need to assess the significance of the matter and whether the person is aware of their actions. Is it truly important to address? Are they oblivious to the harm they've caused? These are vital questions to ponder before speaking up.

Above all, love is the key consideration. In Paul's Letter to the Romans, we are reminded that we owe nothing to anyone except to love one another. Love must be the sole motivation for any critical or confrontational conversation. It should guide our words and actions, demonstrating genuine care for the other person. Any other reason falls short. This approach may seem simple, but it requires discipline. There will be times when we need to keep our mouths shut if the criteria of significance, empathy, and love are not met. Only then can we truly assist someone in finding their way back and facilitating the change they need. And let us not forget, there will also be moments when we need to be open to receiving corrections ourselves.

So, brothers and sisters, as we journey through life, let us approach fraternal correction with humility, empathy, and love. May we strive to build bridges rather than walls, fostering understanding and growth in our relationships. Let us be open to those conversations that invite us to reflect and become better versions of ourselves. Remain blessed!
