


Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Laudetur Jesus Christus, In Saecula Saeculorum! On this 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, let us reflect on our worth in the eyes of God. How do we measure our value, and what does it mean to be worth something to God?

Many of us tend to place ourselves above others, considering ourselves kinder, funnier, and more capable. We rarely think of ourselves as being worth less than others. But when it comes to God, what are we truly worth?

The Gospel passage we just heard challenges our sense of fairness. It tells the story of workers who were paid the same, regardless of the hours they put in. This seems unjust to us, as we believe those who worked longer should receive more. But what if we were the ones who worked the full day? Would we still feel the same?

In this story, most of us would like to see ourselves as the hardworking laborers deserving of the highest reward. We want to believe that others fall short compared to us. How ever, the truth is that we are all like the workers who did not work a full day. We fall short of deserving the blessings that God bestows upon us.

How is this possible? It becomes clear when we examine our actions. Every time we act unjustly, cheat, gossip, disrespect others, or fail to love, we are not giving our full effort. We are not deserving of a full day's pay. This applies to each one of us.

But here's the beautiful part: God does not give us what we deserve. Instead, He showers us with His infinite mercy, generosity, and compassion. He exceeds our expectations and loves us unconditionally. We should be grateful for His love and strive to reflect it in our own lives.

So, what are we worth to God? In a sense, we are worth everything to Him, as demonstrated by the cross. The real question is, what is God worth to us? Are we willing to treasure His love and live according to His example? Remain blessed, Jesus loves you!


