

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Laudetur Jesus Christus, In Saecula Saeculorum! Today, we reflect on the theme of belonging and producing. 

Here are 125 words about Sunday's first reading, and two questions that the reading raises for our community, as a community.

Isaiah's oracle starts **casually**. He's just telling a story: "My friend" went about the routine tasks of planting and cultivating grapes, guarding them and preparing a wine-press. We expect a happy (juicy?) ending. **But the yield is only wild grapes!** The dreadful moral of the story? The failed crop is the nation (ancient Israel) itself! And history will treat it just as a frustrated farmer would treat a failed vineyard.

As we often say of **prophecies** and parables, look for the **startling element** and start your interpretation there. The startling-element device comes from the ancient art of **rhetoric**, of expressing your views in ways that capture the attention of your audience, and then capture their allegiance. The prophets had only speech, and limited writing; they used them effectively and memorably.

Our community communicates internally and externally. How much effort do we put into polishing our rhetoric? Do we enrich our messaging efforts by collaborating in their creation?
