

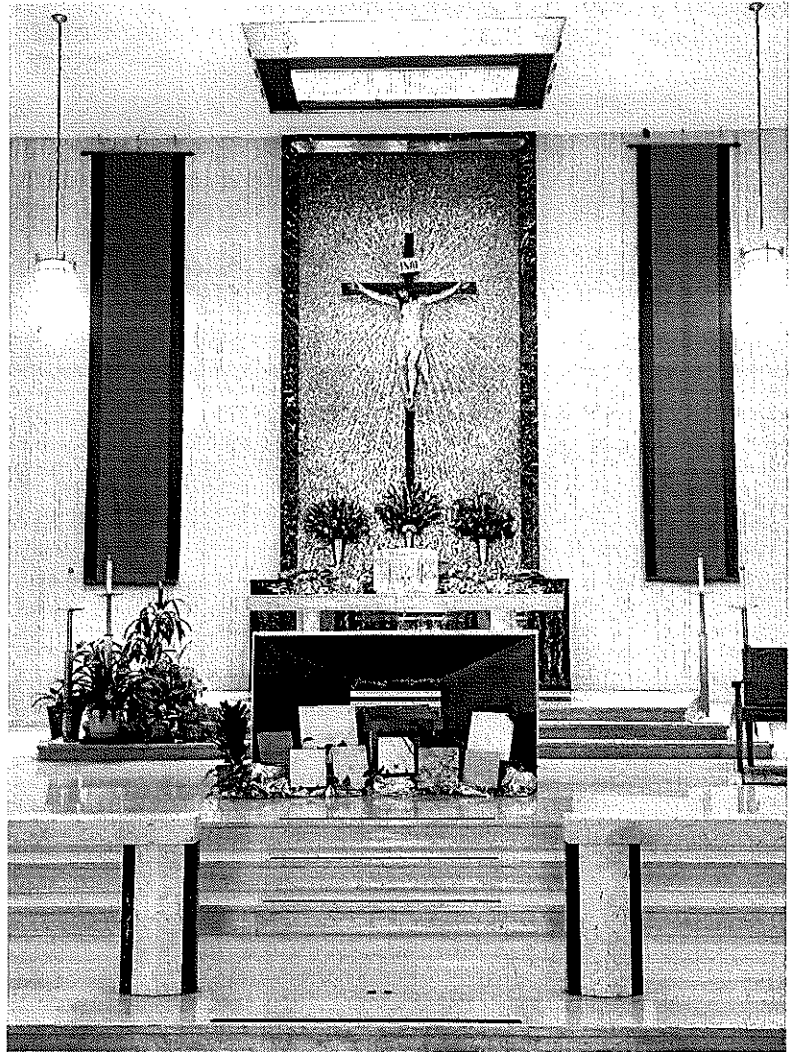

Looking into the Mirror

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Laudetur Jesus Christus! On this Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time, we witness a powerful critique of the priests and religious leaders of the time for failing to live up to their divine calling (Mal. 1:14-2:2.8-10). Paul (1 Thess. 2:7-9.13) reminds the Thessalonians of his unwavering love and commitment in spreading the Good News. Jesus, too, addresses the Scribes and Pharisees, emphasizing the importance of staying on the right path and not leading others astray (Mt. 23:1-12). **The words of the Prophet Malachi serve as a stark reminder of the immense responsibility that rests upon religious leaders. As priests, we must acknowledge our shortcomings and the stumbling blocks we have created for others. It is our duty to strive for greater faithfulness and trustworthiness in both our actions and teachings.**

Leaders, whether they be priests or other figures, are expected to embody goodness and integrity. When they fall short, it can be deeply disheartening and even infuriating. We must recognize the profound impact our actions have on others and the weight of our role as educators.

Teaching extends beyond the confines of the classroom; parents bear the primary responsibility of instilling in their children a sense of right and wrong, and how to be virtuous individuals. However, mere words are insufficient. Our actions must align with our teachings, for children learn more from observing what we do than from what we tell them.

We should acknowledge the skill and dedication required to be a good teacher. While not all of us possess this innate talent, we are grateful for those who choose a life of service to others. Perhaps each of us has a role to play as educators, whether we realize it or not.

Our lives serve as a constant lesson to those around us. The way we speak, act, and treat others speaks volumes and is absorbed by those we encounter. We must be mindful of the impact we have and strive to be the best versions of ourselves, for our actions can either harm or uplift others. **Let us reflect upon the words of Malachi and ask ourselves what we are teaching others through our actions and words. Are we causing others to stumble or helping them flourish? Let us not be hypocrites who demand more from others than we are willing to give ourselves. Instead, let us live in a manner that exudes sincerity and integrity in all that we say and do.**

Prayer: Dear Good Shepherd, we humbly ask for your blessings upon the shepherds who selflessly care for us in your name. Grant us the wisdom to understand how we can foster authentic Christian leadership in our present age. Amen!

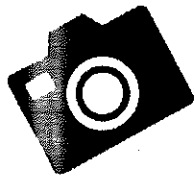

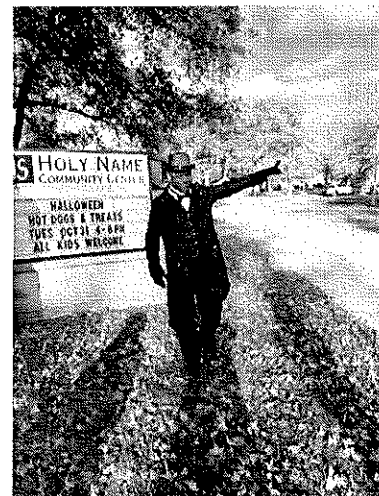

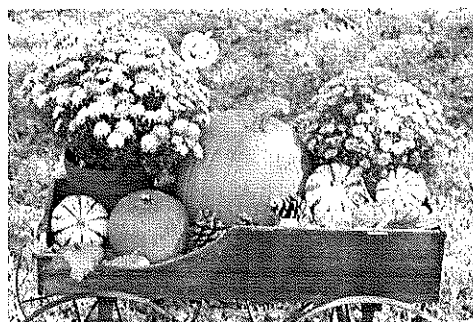

FORMED

To gain access to all of FORMED's content, follow these simple steps:

- Go to <https://signup.formed.org/>
- Enter 63137
- Click on "Holy Name of Jesus St Angela Merici St Norbert"
- Enter your name and your email address

That's it! You're in. Now you can get the free FORMED app for your phone or other devices by searching *FORMED Catholic* in your app store.

Signing up for FORMED is quick and easy. Just follow the simple instructions below.

1. Go to signup.formed.org on your phone or computer browser (You cannot sign up on the app)
2. In the search box, Type: **63137**
3. It will show:
Holy Name of Jesus St Angela Merici St Norbert
4. Click on that
5. Click Next
6. Register with your name and email address
7. Click Sign Up

You can now begin using Formed.

Check your email account for a confirmation link.

You may also download an App for your cellphone, Roku, Firestick, or AppleTV

The first time you use the app you may need to go to your email and click a link to confirm it is you. After that, though, you will be able to login directly and shouldn't have to enter your information again.
