

Dear brothers and sisters, Laudetur Jesus Christus! As we gather on this Sacred Celebration of the Feast of the Holy Family, let us contemplate not only our own families, but also the broader human family and the family of the Church. Before we delve into the essence of holiness within a family, let us take a moment to explore the themes of today's readings: The First Reading (Gen 15:16; 21:1-3) reveals God's promise to Abraham and the fulfillment of an heir. The Second Reading (Heb.11:8.11-12.17-19) highlights the unwavering faith of Abraham and Sarah, and how God's promise was ultimately realized. Lastly, the Gospel (Lk 2:22-40) unveils the presentation of Jesus in the temple, offering us a glimpse into his life in Nazareth.

Now, let us return to the question at hand: What truly makes a family "holy"? It is not about attaining perfection, for no family can claim to be flawless. We all stumble in our actions, engage in arguments, and sometimes neglect our responsibilities. If we define "holiness" as synonymous with "perfection," then every family would fall short. So, what then is the essence of holiness within a family?

As we honor the relationships between Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, we recognize that the Holy Family is unique. Jesus is God, Mary was sinless, and Joseph was a faithful and upright man. Our families do not possess these same characteristics. However, the holiness of the Holy Family lies in their response to God's will. They came together because God wanted them to, and they embraced their roles in faith.

Joseph had a dream, a deep conviction that God wanted him to marry Mary and be the father of a miraculous child. Mary, visited by an angel, knew she was receiving an authentic invitation from God, despite the confusion it may have caused. Jesus, growing in wisdom, gradually understood and embraced the Father's plan for him. The Holy Family came together because they responded to God's call, and God was at the center of their lives.

In the same way, our families can be holy. We may not be God, sinless like Mary, or as faithful as Joseph, but we can believe that God brought our families together with a purpose. We can trust that God has a plan for our families and that He is the glue holding us together. Our challenge is to be the best versions of ourselves as husbands, wives, sons, and daughters.

Perhaps we need the eyes of Simeon and Anna, who recognized the presence of God in the Holy Family. What would happen if we could see God in each other, not only in times of joy but also in the midst of challenges, sorrows, and difficulties? If we can truly see God in one another, we can build the holy families that God desires for us.

Let us ask God to heal the wounds and divisions in our families and the human family. May we embrace God's invitation, respond in faith, and strive to be the holy families that God calls us to be.

Prayer: Divine Creator, on this sacred occasion of the Holy Family Feast, we approach you with reverence, contemplating the essence of a "holy" family. Aware of our imperfections and occasional shortcomings in our interactions and obligations, we seek enlightenment. Guide us to comprehend that holiness transcends perfection, as it lies in our willingness to align with Your divine purpose. As we pay tribute to the extraordinary bond shared by Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, we acknowledge their exceptional qualities. Grant our family peace, through the intercession of the Holy Family. Amen! Have a refreshing and blessed New Year!
