Dear Brothers and Sisters, Laudetur Jesus Christus! As we gather on this Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Scriptures challenge us to listen to God's voice and live out the teachings of Jesus in our daily lives. In the book of Deuteronomy, Moses exhorts the Israelites to heed the voice of the Lord and to follow His commandments. He warns against false prophets, declaring, "But if a prophet presumes to speak in my name an oracle that I have not commanded him to speak, or speaks in the name of other gods, he shall die" (Dt 18:20). This demonstrates the seriousness with which we should approach the word of God.

Moses' words may seem harsh, but they remind us of the importance of discerning the true message of God and not being led astray by false teachings. In the Gospel, our blessed Lord is presented as the ultimate example of one who speaks with both authority and love. His words resonated with divine wisdom and compassion, astonishing those who heard Him. Unlike the scribes, Jesus didn't speak empty words; His teachings held the power to heal the brokenhearted, bring hope to the despairing, and challenge the comfortable.

Dear Brothers and Sisters, In today's chaotic world, the pillars of civility and respect seem to have crumbled. We bear witness to unfiltered and hurtful words being flung around in stores, restaurants, and on social media platforms. Amidst this sea of conflicting messages and ideologies, it becomes paramount for us, as Christians, to be mindful of the voices we allow to shape us. Do we truly grasp the significance of our words? Are we aware of their potential to uplift or wound, to mend or divide? We must remain vigilant against false prophets who aim to lead us astray from the teachings of Jesus. Our words possess the power to either be instruments of God's love and peace or tools of division and destruction. By anchoring ourselves in prayer, Scripture, and the teachings of the Church, we can cultivate the discernment needed to reject falsehood and embrace liberating truth.


